New development will have been designed with sustainable travel in mind and not add to existing traffic problems. New development will be supported by the necessary facilities and infrastructure. Green spaces, including the nature reserve, will be protected and enhanced. New housing will respond to local needs and respect the context of Noak Bridge in terms of type, mix, scale and character. Noak Bridge might grow, but will do so sustainably, not jeopardising all that makes it special. It will embrace the opportunities that new development might bring but not at the expense of health and wellbeing of its residents.
