Local Plan Consultation on Alternative Site H12A Bensons Farm:

Residents complained of the poor notification of the consultation and the little time left to comment on the proposed site. Cllr. Sargent confirmed the consultation was now on the front page of Basildon Council Website. Objections were raised on how the elderly would be affected by the development and the high impact on local roads already

congested and that other local services would also be impacted

Cllr Buckley clarified the Local Plan is a 20 year plan, notification is always difficult. Essex County Council will not support development without infrastructure, particularly Highways. The cost of infrastructure may prove inhibitive. Residents were reminded individually sent comments carried more weight than a petition.

The Parish Council to formulate a response to Basildon Council and add to the minutes

Questions:

A resident asked if the green belt now meant anything - If there were no Brownfield sites available for housing the Government are intending that green belt land is used

Cllr Buckley was asked if the Dale Farm site at Cray's Hill was contaminated - This is not an issue for the Council they are not the land owner

A resident queried the enforcement training - It was explained Cllr's. would be informed of the role of the Council's enforcement policy and any enforcement action they take. Noak Bridge has a special policy it is a conservation area and subject to enforcement

A resident said he was informed at a meeting that Noak Bridge would not be developed. Cllr. Sargent also attended the meeting and said she would check the meeting minutes. They will be available at the next meeting

We had a number of residents at our Parish meeting on 6th December and gave them opportunity to comment on the Local Plan consultation alternative site H12A.

We also encouraged residents to individually comment to the Council

There were complaints of them not knowing about the consultation

The NB Parish Council comments as follows:

We object to alternative site H12A on the grounds of it being within the Green Belt and the prospect of the development of a further 200 houses in close proximity to Noak Bridge Village and Noak Mead will have a negative impact on the existing infrastructure Both of these housing estates are filled with high density housing There is already a proposal to build 380 houses in Wash Road The existing infrastructure cannot cope with one development let alone two The surrounding roads are heavily congested Local facilities are very popular and bring a huge amount of visitors to the area

Local facilities are very popular and bring a huge amount of visitors to the area The school would not have the capacity to cope with additional children

The doctors surgery already has more patients than they can cope with

Even if the infrastructure were to be improved the area would no longer be semi- rural It would become more of a town and lose the character and residential amenity that all the residents enjoy. Noak Bridge will end up merging into Cray's Hill and Burstead Wards.
