We have registered with Bruno Peek the Pageant Master for the Jubilee Beacons and will follow the prescribed timetable: At 9.35pm Pipe Sergeant Chris Jennions from the Sutherland Pipes and Drums will play 'Diu Regnare' and at 9.40pm a Majesty pipe equivalent

At 9.45pm exact local time to coincide with the lighting of the Beacon, the Noak Bridge Primary school choir will sing 'Song for the Commonwealth' and the Beacon will be lit on behalf of the Parish of Noak Bridge. This is a once in a lifetime event that we have great pleasure in taking part and we hope all our local residents will join us to celebrate this great occasion

We are pleased to report that Bluestone Planning have spent the last months gathering evidence to support the policies that will be written for the Neighbourhood Plan. The evidence is required to support the five key 'themes' identified following the September 2019 consultation: Transport; Roads; Education; Health; Housing; Other Local Services; Design & Conservation; Environment & Green Space. Good progress has been made gathering evidence / holding meetings in respect of:

- Highways / Public
  - Transport / Parking
- Local Green Spaces / Rights of Way
- Housing
- Social and Community / Infrastructure
- Environmental issues
- Environmental issues



The draft Community Facilities Study and draft Local Green Space Study have been received and being reviewed at the time of writing. The Character Appraisal and Design Code are being written at the moment and we expect to receive them from the consultants in the next 4-6 weeks.

We have also received a first draft of the policies that could be included in the Neighbourhood Plan. These have been written in light of the evidence that has been gathered, and they will be refined as the character appraisal and design evidence is produced. We intend to spend the next few weeks reviewing the policies and starting to draft the supporting text to accompany the policies; this is an important further step towards preparing the first full draft of the Neighbourhood Plan later this summer. Once the draft Neighbourhood Plan and supporting evidence is ready, we intend to undertake a formal public consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan and associated documents programmed for later this year

Work being carried out is to identify and record the design characteristics and features of the area that are most important to the community will form an important component of the character and design evidence that supports the Neighbourhood Plan and will inform the future design code for the Plan area.
