BUDGET & PRECEPT 2020/2021

The Council set the Budget and a Precept of £44,047.77 at the January meeting. A slight reduction from last year in the basic amount of £43.17 per household.

From April 2019 to March 2020 the Council have not employed a clerk which has resulted in considerable savings in administration. Reserves have built up enabling provision of adequate funding for the Neighbourhood Plan. Administration has been carried out by the Councillors at nil cost to the Council.

The priorities for the coming year include funding of the Neighbourhood Plan, Community Projects, Small Grants, Parish Council Elections and the New Website.

We aim to continue to invest in the Noak Bridge Parish with community support for capital projects

TERM OF OFFICE



The past four years have flown by since our term of office began in May 2016. The Parish Council have made significant changes to the financial spending, capital investment, administration and procedures of the Council. Gone are the excessive administration costs, resources are now spent on the Parish with a mission statement outlining our intentions: 'ensuring value for money as a top priority'. Our term of office ends on 7th May 2020 with the Parish Council Elections.

OUR INVESTMENTS



BT & CCTV administration costs have been reduced while investment in equipment, new CCTV and facilities have increased. Capital investment was made a priority with the provision of a number of community projects being provided by request. Grants to Pre-school, Residents Association & Nature Reserve. Wash Road Playing Field has Fencing around the Dog Agility Course, Bollards & Boulders installed to prevent unauthorised incursions and two new football posts. The Village Hall has benefited from significant

improvements, with the Cloakrooms and Main Hall LED lighting installed, a new Meeting Room facility and a Petanque Court with Portaloo in the garden. Defibrillators at the Medical Centre & Noak Bridge Pub. New Finger Post Signs and investment in Coppice Lane Duck Pond improvements in partnership with Basildon Council. The closure of the current website has meant the construction of a fresh new one ready March 2020

NOAK BRIDGE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN



Our biggest investment project is in the Neighbourhood Plan. It received significant resident support in 2018 when 750 new homes were proposed for development at Noak Bridge, thankfully reduced to 400. The NP with continued resident support will produce policies and procedures to reduce the negative impact the building of new homes will bring. Our aim is to retain the character and uniqueness of the Noak Bridge Conservation Area. A project plan is in place to keep us on track, a traffic assessment and design appraisal are due to be undertaken. The outcome of the resident consultation report is published on the website with next steps being further consultation and community engagement and involvement
