OVRA's "Meet the Councillors" Meeting

On the 4th June this year OVRA held a Meet the Councillors meeting to allow residents to put their concerns to our elected representatives. The new Leader of Guildford Borough Council, Caroline Reeves, and the leader of the newly established Residents for Guildford and Villages Party (R4GV), Mr Josh Bigmore. Onslow Wards newest Councillors, Will Salmon and Jon Askew also attended, and OVRA invited Mr Ken Miller, Chair of Compton Speeding Committee.

The speakers all introduced themselves and then Mr Miller gave a short but interesting description of Compton's continuing fight to control the worst impacts of heavy traffic on the B3000. This has become an extremely busy thoroughfare over the last 40 or so years and Ken described Compton's successes (most notably with noise reducing surfaces, speed monitoring signs, and pollution monitoring) while acknowledging that police and County Council priorities to keep the traffic moving had limited their ability to effectively address the growing problem in the long term. While Onslow Villages traffic problems are of a very different nature there was a great deal of good advice on offer.

The meeting was then opened up to the floor and questions from the audience were put to the Councillors. Great concern was expressed about the local plan in general and Blackwell Farm in particular. Cllr Reeves explained that without a local plan development within the borough would be uncontrolled. While one or two of the audience were in favour of greater building in the borough many were concerned by the way the plan was pushed through just ahead of the election, by the loss of green belt land, and by the impact this will have on traffic congestion. In particular great concern was expressed about the proposed Blackwell farm development. Cllr Reeves explained that this could not go forward until the infrastructure concerns had been satisfied but could not be more specific on what the infrastructure solutions might be. All the panellists agreed that consultation on these matters needs to be better going forward.



A number of questions were asked about potential 'improvements' to the A3 but because this is a matter for the County Council no answers were available. A plan will have to be developed for traffic management in the borough but that is not yet in place. Discussions ranged around what was happening to monitor and control traffic pollution, to increase the use of public transport, and to encourage cycling in the borough but there did not seem to be a coordinated plan for any of these things.

At the ward level concerns were expressed about the traffic chaos around the schools at drop off and pick times, the problems posed by hedges growing out of control, and issues around parking in the borough. Our two new councillors agreed to look into these matters, and promised to set up regular surgeries to allow residents to express their concerns more directly.

All in all it was a very helpful and informative evening. While there are many issues for the borough in general and the ward in the particular to address, and not many clear answers at this time, it is a new administration and it is to be hoped that they will be able to address these issues over time. I am grateful to all the speakers for their time, and for their willingness to answer the questions put to them, some of which were pretty robust at times. I am particularly grateful to our new councillors, who listened intently to the concerns raised and seemed determined to do their best to address them.

Finally my thanks to all who attended. We had over 70 people in the audience, and many of them took an active part in the discussions. While questions were direct and forthright the debates never became aggressive or acrimonious. Not only did that make my life easier, I believe it also allowed us to cover more ground. With so much still to work out we hope to have another of these meetings either later this year or early next year to follow up on some of the matters raised.

Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) is part of this procedure and a valuable potentially life-saving skill.
