Lord and Lady Onslow celebrate with Onslow Village



After the cancellation of planned events last year to mark the 100th year of Onslow Village, the commemoration of this landmark event was celebrated in style on Sunday 19th September. At the conclusion of a project to refurbish the Jubilee Garden, a reception was held in the Village Hall prior to the formal re-opening of the Garden and celebrate the centenary of the village. Lord and

Lady Onslow, the Countess Onslow and Dennis and Mary Booth, the Deputy Mayor and Mayoress of Guildford joined many of the residents in the Village Hall. Adrian Chandler welcomed the visitors on behalf of O.V.R.A.

Lord Onslow gave an informative outline of his family's long association with Surrey including amusing references to the 'Red Fox of Surrey' and Cromwell's opinion of his ancestor and the origin of the Village

project in the drive to provide 'homes fit for heroes' following the First World War. He concluded by expressing his interest in the garden project that was inspired and led by Angela Joule, a local resident of long standing.



The garden was created in 1977 to celebrate the Queen's Silver Jubilee and was in need of some TLC as Angela explained. She suggested that O.V.R.A. adopt it as a project and belated commemoration of the centenary of the village. The undertaking was much more involved and extensive than she ever imagined but with the willing help of many local businesses, council representatives and of course the time and effort of village volunteers the garden refurbishment is now complete.

The Deputy Mayor was then invited to cut the splendid cake that was emblazoned with the village emblem. The OVRA Chairman's wife, Kim Briggs, made this impressive cake which was greatly admired. This, together with a glass of champagne was enjoyed by all present. A display in the hall showed the work on the Jubilee Garden refurbishment. Another display showed many of the activities and facilities in the village that make it such a vibrant community and an archive display showed the history of the village from its' initial construction in 1920.

The assembly then joined the many other villagers outside where Lord Onslow cut the ribbon to formally re-open the garden. The event concluded with those attending admiring the garden and retiring to review the displays in the Hall.



OVRA'S OTHER RECENT ACTIVITIES

Our much delayed 2021 AGM was held on the Tuesday 14th September at the Village Hall, where residents were able to gather and enjoy a sociable drink together before the proceedings. In addition to the usual business, the Chairman thanked the Committee for their work and for agreeing to remain in post until the next AGM in March 2022. He added a special vote of thanks to Mike Joule, who is not on the Committee but has given a great deal of support in numerous ways to the work of OVRA, especially through this difficult period.

The AGM was followed by a presentation "CLIMATE CHANGE. WHAT WE CAN DO" Graham Brown explained the emergence and history of the international response to the climate emergency before handing over to Chris Shaw who presented a range of the practical measures that can be adopted

S.C.C. proposed Pilot following Survey on Traffic Flow in and out of The Drive

Subject to funding in the next financial year, Surrey County Council propose to run a six month pilot. This will take the form of signs and hatch markings and, if improvements are evidenced, a more permanent physical enhancement will be looked at. The pilot will introduce a no left turn in to The Drive as you come down the Hogs Bank (A31) towards Guildford town but you will still be able to turn left or right as you exit The Drive. The indicative timing of this pilot will be July to September (Q2/2022). A Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) will advertise the changes and consultation.

Other works – such as cutting back the vegetation and refreshing the SLOW words on the road surface leading up to the junction – will also be followed through. The cutting back of vegetation – particularly along the stretch of Farnham Road from High View Road to Friars Gate - will involve Surrey Highways & Guildford Borough Council working with residents who own stretches of land in this location. More on this over the coming weeks.
