# Challenges to our Village Life <



Why do you live in Onslow Village? I would guess the easy transport links by rail and road and the sought after schools enticed you, and the pleasant and scenic local environs, proximity to attractive shops and a strong local community kept you here.

How would you feel about it though if the traffic regularly snarled up on Madrid Road/The Chase and these exit points from the village were blocked as well as the Farnham Road? What if the local school was too full for your children so they had to travel on congested routes to the other side of Guildford? How will they complete the journey independently if the bus service doesn't continue? What if you need to take your other child/vulnerable family member to their GP appointment in Stoughton – a round trip which will take the greater part of your working day. Meanwhile your tooth aches and you really need the time to search for an NHS dentist nearby.

I hate being pessimistic and overly negative but all of the above scenarios are distinct possibilities at the moment, due to short term thinking and lack of a coherent vision for Guildford. There are a number of housing development projects nearby which will together directly impact on traffic, parking, and local schools. Separately the Guildown and Woodbridge Hill GP practices are looking at options which include closing the only GP practice our side of the A3 and the river (see enclosed flyer with respect to meeting on Tuesday, 13th September). The bus service could be under threat and I believe NHS dentist services already are non existent.

What can we all do? If you feel strongly about this I would firstly urge you to make your views known in the various public consultations underway. We will try to keep you updated via our website. (We'd like to do more on other social media but this needs someone to take on this role for us).

OVRA itself has a rather wide remit to work to promote the amenities of the area and enhance the quality of life for all village residents, whether members or not. We will flag these concerns to the authorities via the public consultations but are somewhat constrained by lack of manpower and resource from launching full scale campaigns.

Finally, join in with others committed to campaigning for better outcomes for Onslow Village and Guildford. Please get in touch via the website and we will put you in touch with some other like-minded residents.



#### **Jubilee and Centenary Garden Update**

It doesn't seem possible that it will be a year ago in September since the garden refurbishment was completed and we had the official opening ceremony performed by Lord and Lady Onslow with the Deputy Mayor in attendance together with the subsequent reception in the Village Hall.


Our main concern thereafter was how the plants would survive through the winter and beyond, especially with the extreme heat we experienced in July. At the planning stage we were careful to choose plants which tolerate shade as well as dry conditions. We were also determined not to let it befall the same fate as the original Jubilee Garden which eventually fell into terminal decline.

As there is no access to water on site, we have to say a huge thank you to a very generous neighbour who has very kindly continued to give us access to water and with the use of OVRA members' hoses linked together, has enabled the garden to have a good soaking several times. This has been an enormous help and together some of the OVRA committee and volunteers who have also transported water in a variety of containers, we have managed to keep all the original plants alive and thriving.

In addition, these volunteers have regularly weeded, swept and washed the benches to keep the garden as fresh as the day it opened, so, our grateful thanks to everyone concerned. The next test will be through the coming winter and spring to ensure that everything manages to survive again.

Looking back at the photos we took of the area before the project started it really has been

quite a transformation and it is rewarding to see it being used and enjoyed as a restful place to sit and hopefully relax. I am very proud of what, with a small group of people, we have been able to achieve.

### **ROUTE 18 BUS SERVICE**

Safeguard has recently learnt that it has lost the contract to operate local bus route Route 18, purely on grounds of price which is hugely disappointing given the efforts Safeguard has made to run a friendly, reliable and well publicised service which is being used by more people than previously. The new operator has not yet been named. Safeguard's last day running Route 18 will be Saturday 27 August 2022 and the new operator will start running from the start of the following week. 
