THE OVRA ARCHIVES



Prior to Covid the committee gathered together the archive material that we had been storing relating to OVRA with the intention of asking Woking History Centre to accept it. Covid struck and the project was shelved until recently. Later, the History Centre was contacted, who agreed to take it. This material contained a unique story of the village in the intervening years since the formation of OVRA in 1956. All this material has now been submitted to the History Centre which in the process of assessing and cataloguing it. Catalogue reference number 10439.

In addition, when Onslow Village Ltd was wound up in 1984, all surviving documents, minute books etc., were also handed to the Woking History Centre and subsequently achieved by them. This material is available to access via their website (below). Catalogue reference is 1807

Local Matters Compiled by Ray Briggs

Partly as a result of views expressed at the open meeting on the proposed changes to Wodeland Surgery, OVRA has committed to keep members updated on ongoing issues in the area. As views on these matters will vary amongst residents, we do not have a view on any of the matters reported here. We only wish to keep residents informed of developments.

NW Guildford GP Estates Development

Nothing has really changed on this since Surrey Heartland was forced to pull out of the planned open meetings last year. As you will recall Surrey Heartlands is looking at ways to redevelop the surgeries currently under the Guildown and Woodbridge Hill practices. While no decision has been taken as yet, proposals have included consolidating the surgeries at larger premises in Park Barn and at the Jarvis Centre. These proposals may result in the closure of the Wodeland Avenue surgery. Development of these proposal has been effected by budget restrictions in the NHS and Surrey Heartlands is working with partners explore a route to fund options and solutions. As a result, engagement with interested parties and consultation has been delayed and will not take place as planned in early 2023. We do not have information on when this will take place, but will continue to engage with Surrey Heartlands and keep you all informed.

Cathedral housing 21/P/02333

An email sent before Christmas from Friends of Stag Hill (FOSH) announced a modified application with a fresh set of documents produced (some 1200 pages). FOSH commentary suggested that not much had changed and they intend to continue to oppose this development.

32 Queen Eleanors Road 21/P/01411

This application to divide the property has been refused. Main reasons cited are cramped living space, overdevelopment and the proposal not being in keeping with the area. The applicant has lodged an appeal which awaits a decision from the planning inspector.

Guildford Park Road Development.

The OVRA AGM will be held on 14 March in the Village Hall. Doors open at 7.30 pm. Following the meeting there will be a presentation by Ross Kelway, Public Engagement Manager at the University of Surrey on some of the exciting projects being undertaken there.
