1. Opening remarks the Parish Council Chairman on behalf of the Parish

3. Reports from Community Groups

• <u>Telephone box refurbishment for a Book Swop.</u>

A resident outlined plans for using the telephone box as a community book swop centre which she volunteered to administer. These plans would include using the Village Hall as an overflow/sorting area to hold reserve donated stock. Provided the shelving was installed appropriately it should also be possible to offer Children's books and magazines in addition to books.

Cllr Holland confirmed that this proposal was acceptable to the Village Hall and the Clerk confirmed that the refurbishment work and painting of the box should be completed over the next 8 weeks. This would allow a launch to take place in August/September. The resident agreed to develop an article for pleshey Parish News as part of the launch.
