1 to discuss item 11 - There was a presentation on the reasons behind the removal of the mobile library (lack of use - One user on one occasion in 6 months). One option is to replace the mobile service with a community library - the cost savings arise from the cancellation of the mobile library service in Pleshey cannot be passed back to the Parish to help fund a community library. A community library can be set up in 4-6 weeks. The Library service will supply 200 books that can be changed every quarter (or more often). The books supplied by Essex Library service would need to be kept secure and insured (fire & theft).

Possible locations could be the Village Hall , the Leather bottle ,the House of retreat or the Church.

6. Report from ECC and CCC attending Councillors

Report from CCC - The Ballot for the BID (Business improvement district) went through with a majority of the businesses showing their favour. A company will now be formed (1st April) and matters will move along swiftly. The members of the company are discussing innovative ideas that will improve the city centre to become a showcase for activities leading up to Chelmsford being a City of Culture.

The City council is in discussions with police and outside bodies to consider the implementation of police orders to be imposed on people fly posting and advertising near the highways. (July this year)

We are including many more charging points for electric cars in City owned car parks. Homelessness: A new Act has been introduced to tighten up the current legislation thus strengthens the duty for housing advice to all residents with improvements designed for certain vulnerable groups in mind, including care leavers, former armed forces etc.

Sunday Times this weekend indicated that Chelmsford was "the place" to live in the East of England

11. Do we need a community library?

There was a long discussion on benefits and the support needed to function as a community library.

An organisation would need to fill in an expression of interest and send to the library service. The Service would run the same as a normal library and books can be ordered and reserved. Books would then either be delivered or picked up from a location such as Broomfield library.

12. Allotments - Rental and tenancy agreements
