Its been another good year at sailability (sailing for the less fortunate) wheelchair bound to any impediment. All are welcome we have one of the best located club houses, 12 specialized sailing boats, electronic hoists and a small tractor for launch and recover. We could do with a few more helpers from launching the boats to making the tea. If you know of anyone who is suffering for any reason, please give me a ring on 01268 76828. Sailing on Hanningfield reservoir closed over the winter and starts in the spring, full guidance and tuition is given.

The autumn horticultural show in the village hall was once again a great success. Liz Jones' daughter (aged 14) carried the fruit cup for scoring the most points. I did not enter the longest runner bean as Mr Cole surely hangs lead weights on his, while they are growing! Our Veg patch, I share with Jonathon, is a working one, most of our planting grows by luck rather than expertise. But growing your own does taste better than the supermarket, especially greens! Country Diary

What a display there is in our hedgerows! I do not think I have seen so many haws for a long time. The road between Hoe Lane and le Benaix is just one mass of berries. As children, we used to call these fruits 'bread and cheese'. The hips are good as well and I remember picking them as a child for the production of rose hip syrup. (I think you will be able to age me now) The wild blackberries are also very productive if a little seedy and small early on.

The fruits of autumn are very plentiful this year – the acorns, the chestnuts and the Sorbus berries. Also the Sloes, those little dark blue polished circles of fruit peeping out from the foliage in the hedge

Have you seen any swallows lining up on the telephone wires? I have not but the barns near to my house have now been replaced by housing, so perhaps the swooping, and diving of these lovely little birds are a thing of the past.

I have put a hedgehog box in my front garden hoping to entice one of these creatures to hibernate in it. Hedgehog numbers are declining rapidly and as my front garden is not fenced, it may become a safe haven for these prickly little creatures. Fences are a barrier to hedgehogs, as they do not allow these animals to forage and roam. My back garden is fenced to keep the dog in – in doing so preventing free movement for the

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Council meeting at the end of July had a full agenda although decisions on all items were not made. The bus shelters have been looked at over the summer and the Council is planning to undertake repair, maintenance and cleaning of all these where necessary. The new Grant Policy and training for the Clerk for next vear's elections were agreed.

At an extraordinary meeting at the beginning of September the Council's response to the Chelmsford Local Plan Draft Planning Obligations Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was discussed and submitted on the following day.

The Bell Fields - the Council has submitted an application to the Charity Commission to commence proceedings to clarify the position with regard to appointment of trustees.
