Not up to it this time - don't worry, our judge has agreed to show us how to exhibit our flowers for the best effect and to show standard. And we already have a few

- \* Angle & poise: daffodil is pointing straight at you, not tilted up or down.
- \* The neck is holding the bloom correctly, stem down the middle of the flower.
- \* Size & symmetry: size in multi vase are the same, flowers are symmetrical.
- \* Staging: Include up to 3 leaves with a single bloom, or 3-5 leaves for multi-blooms. Leaves no higher than the blooms. Stage multi-blooms in the vase at different heights for effect - centre one higher.

#### **Battlesbridge Matters**

I am very pleased to report, two Sundays ago, on the Bell Field, two full games of football were played, which totalled nearly 70 players, refs and linesmen. The reason being, most if not all the surrounding pitches were unplayable due to being waterlogged!

We are proud that our drainage system worked so well, and contrary to the adverse report from Chelmsford, condemning our work, ie. the drains are running in totally the wrong direction, implying the drains are just mole ploughed, etc. and the cost of getting the pitch into a playable condition will cost some £16,000 before a game of football can be played. I still have copies of this misleading report, I dread to think the report, and its commissioner, were trying to make the case that the upper Bell Field is a unviable project, especially as it states that approximately £15,000 plus will be need for annual maintenance. The truth of the matter is that the Bells Field now have a regular income, and the Managing Trustee's will have £5,000 in the bank by the end of the month, and hopefully the North Boundary fence will be nearly finished.

The fund raising dinner at the Royal Tiger, organised by Liz Jones and Friends of the Bell Fields was a resounding success. Nearly 140 residents turned up. The food and the company were super, if not rather noisy, especially when the raffle was being called. Over Two Thousand pounds was raised to go towards the new proposed multi-purpose pavilion. This will be funded by sport England or a similar charity, and part funded by residents. Thank you to every one who supported us. Liz is also working on a summer event on the Bell Field.

The Dart Bus service is still running well. Please let me know of any complaints, praises, or suggestions, and I will pass them on the Manager. They do welcome feed back.

If you know of anyone who is recovering from an illness or who suffers from a disability, and feel they would benefit from a day on the water, or just sitting in the sunshine with a cup of tea, just give me a ring, and we will see if we can help. The Sail Ability Club house is right on the banks of Hanningfield Reservoir. We could also do with a few more on the shore party, helping to launch and rig our boats with instruction. Remember spring is just round the corner. THE OLD SAYING MARCH COMES IN LIKE A LION AND GOES OUT LIKE A LAMB, IS QUITE TRUE.

And lastly, I have been campaigning strongly to save the reconstruction of a 150 year old Essex Marsh Barn, at the end of Malting Road, in Battlesbridge. It is in the grounds of Woods Farm. I have been a councillor for nearly 16 years and this is one of the worst planning situations, I have ever come across, to put it mildly I am Very Angry. I will try and protect this wonderful project and the family to the end. The building has been restored to the same dimensions as the old barn, same roof line, brick Plinths etc. The builder took down the old rotting building and plinth to lay the 2 metre footings, requested by building Control. The only thing they did wrong was not to leave part of a wall up. Planning was passed for this building. All of a sudden the building is deemed to be an eyesore and inappropriate in the green belt. There was no ill intent, and now we have lost the appeal. I am planning to take it to the High Court. I petitioned the local residents; they were 100 % in favour for its retention. I am not taking a penny for this action. There does not seem to be any balance of planning policy in the area, and its wrong.....

On a more pleasant note do not forget the annual Daffodil competition in March in the village Hall.
