Course to be carried out by qualified trainers from the Essex Community First Aid Events Volunteers.

Parish jottings

Nostalgia is not usually used as a convenient peg to hang your hat on particularly as there is always someone else who has a bit more information than you have, anyway here are a few matters of interest which occupied the parish council in forties and fifties.

The Turnpike In 1946 the Parish Council (PC) agreed to press Essex County Council (ECC) to construct a new roundabout at the turnpike but at the time there was no electricity or gas in the parish to enable it to be illuminated. In 1969 the PC were still pressing ECC for a roundabout at the turnpike.

Parish boundary Following requests from residents and action at a Public enquiry the minister of Health confirmed in 1948 an alteration in the parish boundary confirming that Hoe Lane, Chalk Street and Warren Road would be transferred from Runwell to Rettendon.

Electricity A matter which took up a great deal of the PC's time during the late forties and early fifties was getting an electricity supply to the parish. It came in stages, firstly from the Bell area up to Hoe Lane. The next stage was from Hoe Lane to the Parish Church (including the housing estate). Homes along the Woodham road and Battlesbridge were not supplied until November 1949.

Main Drainage was a subject for discussion in 1954 and the first phase of the work started in 1969. The completion of the main drainage scheme for the parish did not happen until the mid to late seventies. I understand there are still some residents' properties in the parish who by choice, are still not connected to the main drainage system.

Battlesbridge Matters

I am sitting in my kitchen, there is a gale blowing outside, with driving rain on the window panes. Is this February or August? I know we had a very few hot days, but the sum of mean temperatures, I feel will show a drop in the year on year temperatures. I am still not convinced of Global Warming. The TV pictures of the arctic (I have been up there in my time) show all the ice is melting. September is the warmest month of the year in the arctic. The picture in December is the reversal of it. I take a great interest in tides and the weather.

We have had reports of broken glass bottles and rubbish near the goalposts on the Bell Fields. The new posts have been damaged and the signage too. If you see any form of suspicious or damaging behaviour, please ring the police and photograph with your mobile and ring me on 01268 768282. The Registered Trustees are here to protect the Bell Fields for the Parish at all costs.

I am extremely pleased to report after the 86 pages of misconduct against me by the Chairman of the Parish Council and 9 major charges, heard in Chelmsford City Council on the 22nd July, no further action will be taken. The judgement can be seen on the City Council website at https://www.chelmsford.gov.uk/_resources/assets/inline/full/0/2714103.pdf. The Governance Committee described the Parish Council as dysfunctional and recommended mediation in respect of the Bell Fields dispute. It was a long haul. The case must have cost £12K plus. What a dreadful waste.

I am still fighting to save the barn at Gosses Farm. It will be going to court soon. The old 150 year Essex Marsh Farm Barn was riddled with damp and beetles rot. The new rebuild, on the same footprint, with size and proportion to the nearest ½ inch. The planning now want it demolished. I was so angry when I found out what has been going on, I will support the family to the end.

I have presented a silver engraved jewellery box to Jackie Copsey on behalf of the Parish, for the tremendous work Jackie has achieved in nearly 20 years as a parish Councillor. On behalf of the Parish, a big THANK YOU, but Jackie will still be on the help desk at the Village Show and checking all the footpaths, etc. etc.
