## RETTENDON MEMORIAL HALL REMEMBRANCE COFFEE MORNING, Saturday, 9th November 10am till 12pm (noon)



#### 75th Anniversary of D-Day.

#### D-Day - and weather to go or not to go......

No - it is not a spelling mistake. The days leading up to the D-Day landings were fraught with decisions. Supreme Commander General Eisenhower had to decide when to send out the ships with the allied troops over to France for the final push in World War II.

The problem was knowing what the weather would do. Bad weather and ships and troops could be lost, and fighting men become too seasick to act. Good weather meant alert fighting men.

Two meteorologists were asked for their opinions: one an American, one a Scotsman. Who to believe? Who best to predict the weather?

While the American, Krick, Eisenhower's own weatherman, forecasts another day of good weather, Stagg, the British chief meteorologist, forecasts rain and high winds.

Luckily for us, and for the troops, Eisenhower chose correctly, following Group Captain James Stagg's recommendation to delay. And the rest, as they say, is history.

There were many men killed on D-Day on both sides, but there could have been even more casualties had not the right decision been made at the right time. **Barbara Wright**

#### **Defibrillators**

At last the defibrillators at Rettendon Memorial Hall and Battlesbridge Free Church Hall are now up and running, having had their batteries and pads replaced, and the boxes have been given their designation and are properly registered with the Ambulance Service.

We are still awaiting the replacement defibrillator for the box outside the Bell Public House. If this is not delivered soon we will have to chase - it has been ordered and will be put into operation the moment it becomes available.

The defibrillator at Hayes Park is, and always has been, working. It is now on the maintenance list as well.

The maintenance will include a monthly check of the devices to ensure they are operational, although most have their own internal check daily. The check will be recorded and held by the Ambulance Service, and hopefully by the Parish Council Clerk as well.

If you notice any of these boxes are beeping, please let me know as it indicates the battery is low, and we can deal with it.

We would like to point out that all defibrillators, like fire extinguishers, do need to be maintained. The connecting pads and batteries have a shelf/ operational life. **Barbara Wright 01245 321554**

Country Diary

Recently we have seen large skeins of Geese flying over Rettendon and people have been asking me what species they are etc. I have very little knowledge of them so off I went to Hanningfield Nature Reserve at the reservoir to find out more. To my astonishment, they told that they were mainly Greylag mixed with Pink footed and perhaps Brent geese and perhaps Brent geese.

I had never heard of the Greylag and had to research the information. Apparently, they have an amber conservation status and are protected under the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981. It is the largest of the wild geese native to the UK and has been re-established by release into the wild in the south and east leaves and grasses of probably why we are their feeding habits. Oh, and yes they release into the wild. They can be seen all the year round in the south and east and they feed on grass roots, cereal leaves and grasses on the inter tidal marshes which is probably why we are seeing them now as the tides suit

Oh, and yes they are noisy birds honking as they fly overhead in their distinctive V formation.
