Country Diary

I have to be careful of what I write as I have been notified that the geese flying over were Canada geese but not Greylag geese. I have been researching other species that migrate to Britain one of them is Redwings which look like small Thrushes. The difference is that they have a rusty red colouring under their wings. The Fieldfare is also a winter visitor which I have often seen in the past on the Bell field, alongside the old Woodham Road and also at Hyde Hall. They feed on farmland and rough pasture and they do love to eat Hawthorn berries. Both the Fieldfare and Redwing flock. They migrate from Northern Europe to our warmer climes.

We have had a fabulous autumn for fungi. Always beware of this showstopper, the Fly agarics, which is really poisonous. It is bright red with white spots. There are so many fungi with weird names and shapes – the Gonderina – a bracket fungus; a tiny fungus with a common name of Birds nest - a bearded tooth looking a bit like a waterfall. However, the time has now passed as we have had a few frosts and the fungi have disappeared until the next autumn.

Battlesbridge and Surrounding Areas Really Do Matter

With 1000s of new houses being built especially in Maldon, Burnham, Rochford, etc. the infrastructure just cannot cope. Between 7 and 8:45am and 4:20 to 6:30pm the roads are gridlocked in places, especially if just one vehicle breaks down, or there are roadworks underway. Then it is almost No Go. Hours on journeys give a horrendous increase in exhaust pollution. Solution is a minimum of 2 people in a car, only cars with even or odd number plates restricted to alternate days, tax cars by their lengths as well as emissions, etc. South East Essex seems to be taking the brunt. Release all farm land round London, so public transport will play a great role i.e. peoples' journeys to the city, etc. will be minimal.

Flooding carries on, especially in Rawreth Lane and Hullbridge. The natural soakaway from rain has been eroded greatly. Church Road in particular have about 12 properties which get flooded regularly now. Either Rochford Council should build the residents new properties on higher ground by releasing farm land or upgrading the specification of their existing houses. Building 10 houses where you are building in 100s is a small cost. I feel Rochford Council could have a problem with a charge of irresponsible planning. You cannot pass planning applications for large development knowing full well that your decision will lead to established residents' homes being ruined by excess flooding.

I am hoping to arrange a coach trip for 5 days to Cornwall from Rettendon visiting the Eden project, Lost Gardens of Heligan, etc., under the umbrella of the Horticultural Society, in May 2020. Further details to come such as costs, etc. Check the newsletters.

I have been on a Holland coast trip, wonderful people, but I was asked a couple of times why I was wearing a poppy in my lapel? Perhaps they have a different flower for Remembrance. After a 4 hour wait at Amsterdam airport but only 35 minute flight to Southend, it was wonderful arriving back to Battlesbridge and sleeping in a warm bed.

OCTOBER (but don't worry now will do)

Select plants, cut down to about 6 inches, and bring into greenhouse. Keep fairly dry. Start watering to encourage growth in February. Check for aphids and spray when necessary.

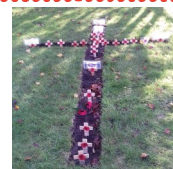
