Chrysanthemum Growing Instructions.

Continuing our growing programme for Autumn Show plants

April: If plants are outgrowing their pots move up to 5 inch pots and move them into a cold frame if it's not too cold. Some cultivars will need stopping (pinching out) towards the end of the month.

May: Prepare the ground. Dig in compost/manure and give a dressing of a general purpose fertilizer. Plan the plot and put in canes. Plant and tie in the plants to the cane. Complete stopping and select the breaks (shoots) to grow on. Aim for 3 good strong breaks per plant. Feed fortnightly with high nitrogen feed. Recommended is Chrysanthemum Direct feed as it is very easy to use and very effective.

June : Watch out for pests and keep a general eye on the progress of the plants. Tie into canes. Leaf miner can be a problem. Continue to feed fortnightly.

As I write this contribution we are still in March but April is the month for wild life and wild flowers. I researched my reference books and found that the poets similarly found the month of April uplifting. Wordsworth, Shakespeare, Tennyson, and Brookes have all written about this month – Who has not heard the poem, "Oh to be in England now that April's there."

A very valuable source tells me the skylark is singing over Curry Hill. My informant also tells me this is an early event this year. Like many children of my era, I used to keep a record of the first sighting of the arrival of visiting birds or the first primrose etc.

At the moment the lesser celandine is blooming, their yellow starlight flowers shine like gold in the sunshine. There is a lovely clump of white violets in Rettendon place – much rarer than the bold Dog violets. As a child, I used to gather a bunch of white violets for my Mother on Mother's day.

April 23rd (St Georges Day) was traditionally the day to pick dandelions for the making of dandelion wine. However, the dandelions have this year been flowering for months already, and who makes dandelion wine these days? Cowslips are another April flower, (another wine ingredient). It used to grow in profusion in the area; however, artificial fertilisers have killed them.

The birds are mating and building their nests, the flowers are budding, and spring has sprung. A little bit of folk law. "April weather, rain and sunshine both together."
