DEFIBRILLATORS

The news about a defibrillator saving a footballer's life at Euro 2020 has prompted us to reiterate the locations of the 4 defibrillators which the Parish Council have supplied throughout the Parish.

- 1) The Bell Public house, East Hanningfield Road, outside the front (Yellow box).
- 2) At the entrance to Rettendon Memorial Hall, Main Road, Rettendon Village (Yellow Box)
- 3) At Battlesbridge Free Church Hall entrance, Hawk Hill, Battlesbridge (Red Box).
- 4) Outside the Club House at Hayes Country Park (Clear Box).

The use for all is the same:

- In an emergency please dial 999 and ask for the Ambulance Service for the 'unlocking code' of the defibrillator box. Tell them the emergency and ask for an ambulance. They may tell you to stay on the line, and talk you through.
- To remove, enter the code, press against the door and turn the handle as indicated.
- Take the defibrillator to the patient. Open the box and switch on - it will tell you what to do! The unit will not function unless it determines there is a need, so do not worry about using one. No one will criticise you for trying to save a life!
- Please return the defibrillator to the box, and inform the Parish Council.

HERBS – How to make refreshing Summer drinks

It is well known that we should all drink more water, especially in hot weather. Adding herbs can make this drink more enjoyable and

interesting, and some herbs offer healing properties. Now that the Communal Herb Garden at the village hall is established you are welcome to pick herbs for your own use or maybe you already grow your own. Either way, here is one way of using herbs.

Cold Infusion:

Gently squeeze or bash the leaves of your chosen herbs to allow the natural fragrance to release. Fill a large jug or jar with cold water and add a sprig of herbs or a small bunch of leaves. You can put the herbs into a piece of muslin or cheesecloth if you have it, or strain before use. Either way, leave the water overnight or for a few hours to infuse. Understand the properties of a herb before you use it, as each is different, and experiment with different varieties adding more or less according to preference. You can also add a slice of cucumber, lemon, or a teabag for additional flavour if liked. Green and white tea are recommended, leave your black tea for a mug and milk!

Here are a few suggestions, you only need a small amount in each instance:

A sprig of Rosemary, peppermint leaves (with or without a green teabag), a slice of fresh ginger with

chamomile flowers, lemon balm, dried lavender flowers (with or without a slice of fresh lemon). Or try a combination of 2 herbs together.



TIP - Freeze

herbs in ice cubes to make your drink look special.

You can buy cold infusion tea bags in supermarkets, but why do this when you can make your own? Have fun making these healthy sugar free drinks, and remember to keep hydrated!

A picture chart on the back of the notice board identifies the herbs.

Rettendon Horticultural Society - The Summer Show

The 4 week extension of the current COVID restrictions has caused a major headache in terms of holding our Summer Horticultural Show. We have been in touch with various bodies for guidance but have been unable to get any definitive answers. It is therefore with much regret that we are no longer able to proceed with the show on the 10th July as planned.

The easiest decision would be to abandon the show altogether but we felt that we should explore every option open to us before taking that action. One such option was to have a marquee event after the 4 week extension. This was dependent on the availability of the cricket field but the cricket clubs fixtures are such that this is not possible. My thanks goes to the cricket club for their efforts to rearrange fixtures.

All is not lost because we have decided to postpone the show until the weekend of Saturday, 31st July. This will be a scaled down show to cover sections A-Roses, B-Flowers, C- Fruit and D - Veg. The remaining sections to include Cookery, Crafts, Floral Art and children's exhibits will be included in our Autumn Show.

The village hall is now open but currently we are undecided whether the show will be inside or outside. Much will depend on any restrictions that remain in place at the time. If any such restrictions are too onerous we will have no choice but to abandon the show completely.

A great deal of heart searching and effort has gone into trying to keep this event up and running so please support us by putting in some entries and coming to the show.

The wild flowers are blooming and the grass is growing at a furious rate but it is the wild flowers that have caught my attention this month; dog roses and honeysuckle festoon the hedgerows and clumps of white elder making a

Groups of foxgloves stand straight on the banks and red poppies grow amongst the margarite daisies. Sometimes these daisies are called moon daisies and their colours are quite eye catching when growing together. The cow parsley and hog weed have been the backbone of most waysides with members of the vetch family adding colour.

I was walking along the footpath adjacent to the main road (the bell pub to the school) the other day and I counted 20 different species of flowers. Some folks like to see these areas mown like a cricket pitch, but me – I like the abundance of the flora alive with insects and wild life of all shapes and sizes.

Have you seen any butterflies? I have seen some small

blues and orange tips and, I think, some small whites and a little earlier in the year the brimstone.

My big disappointment has been not hearing the cuckoo – it will be flying away soon leaving its legacy of eggs in other bird's nests. I once saw a cuckoo's egg in a robins nest when I was a teenager, which means a long time ago.




Battlesbridge Free Church
