This time of the year is both beautiful and exciting. It is a month full of colour and expectation. I love daffodils and their golden yellow flowers waving gently in the wind is a glory to behold. The poem by Wordsworth comes to mind, "I saw a crowd, a host of golden daffodils, beside the lake beneath the trees, fluttering and dancing in the breeze —" The pale vellow primroses like to hide in the ditch lines.

The pale yellow primroses like to hide in the ditch lines, under the hedgerow or in the shadows of the garden. When I was a child we used to gather bunches of them to decorate the church. However you sometimes now have to search for the violets white or dog.

I have never seen wood anemones here in Rettendon but have seen them in woodland in nearby villages. They carpet the woods with blue bells waiting to come out. There used to be cowslips growing alongside the wood not far from Rectory Lane but chalk based fertilisers have put paid to them. However I have seen a quantity of them on the banks alongside the road to Braintree. The hedgerows are also full of blossom, the billowing white of the blackthorn or the pale pink red cherry.

Unfortunately a couple of red cherry trees came down in the churchyard in the recent storms. The wood is beautifully marked and sought after by wood turners and is also a good burner. The trees are beginning to burst their leaf buds, horse chestnuts being one of the earliest to do so. KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK

Praying during Lent and Easter

For many Christians Lent and Easter are a roller coaster of thoughts and emotions.

Lent (an old English word associated with Spring and the <u>lengthening</u> of the day) is a time of preparation in the church as it is in the garden. Preparing our minds and hearts for the Easter message as the gardeners prepare the ground and plant the seeds.

As we move towards Good Friday and follow Jesus' journey to the cross, we remember the cost of love. St John remembered Jesus' words 'Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down your life for your friends'. When we also hear Jesus words 'Take up your cross and follow me', there is certainly enough to reflect on during Lent.

Yet we know something that the first disciples who shared Jesus' journey to his execution could not grasp. Such love is powerful, the greatest power in the world, a power stronger even than death. It is this victory of Love over hate and violence that is celebrated on Easter day.

As we are bewildered by the insanity of another war in Europe and see again peoples' lives being devastated and torn apart by violence and hate, we have more need than ever to follow the journey of love in the hope and faith that love will ultimately be victorious.

Within the scenes of devastation, we see that love is not extinguished as there are acts of immense courage and commitment. Courage not only on the battlefield but also of people opening their homes to strangers and being generous with gifts. The Archbishops have given us a prayer that may be helpful:

> God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine today.

We pray for peace and the laying down of weapons. We pray for all those who fear for tomorrow, that your Spirit of comfort would draw near to them. We pray for those with power over war or peace, for wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide their decisions. Above all, we pray for all your precious children, at risk and in fear,

that you would hold and protect them.

We pray in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.
