

All Saints celebration of the Platinum Jubilee



Our celebration for Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee falls on Pentecost weekend. This seems profoundly appropriate as we celebrate Her Majesty's faithful service over the

years which has been inspired and strengthened by her faith. As she said in her Millennium Christmas Broadcast:

'For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life.'

Pentecost (seven weeks or fifty days after Easter) is when the Church remembers God's gift of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. It gave them the courage and ability to proclaim the Good News and enabled them to meet the needs of people around them, healing and encouraging them.

As we give thanks for the reign of Her Majesty we also pray for the nations of the commonwealth, including our own, and the Church of England which she leads. We pray that the same spirit that inspired the first disciples will continue to guide her, our leaders and indeed ourselves, as we dedicate ourselves to working for the values which have inspired her reign.



Would that the youth of today, were taught this Christian approach to life. Would that they take an example from our Queen for the way of life. Then there would be not so many suffering from mental health problems or needing a knife to help them feel safe. There would not be the need to constantly challenge authority. But parents and teachers, any in authority, are also under life's same obligations in Christ.
