She was a big part of our school, known and loved by all the staff and families – we will miss her immensely. We were also sad to discover that our Head Teacher, Mrs Sloper was leaving at the end of the academic year. In the 4 years that she had been at the school, Mrs Sloper made such a positive impact and the school has gone from strength to strength in so many areas. She too will be sorely missed and we wish her well in all her new endeavours. I, therefore, take up the reins on 1 September as Head Teacher and look forward to a continued close relationship with the local Rettendon community.

On top of that we placed well in the local primary sports and swimming gala amongst other things. It just goes to thank you all in the local community, our parents and children for a successful school year, hope you a had a great summer and we look forward to all the new school year has in store for us all.
