Lent 2023: Finding God in All Things

One of my great heroes was the Rev Canon John Polkinghorne. He died a couple of years ago but in his time was professor of mathematical physics at Cambridge University and President of Queen's College Cambridge. As you might imagine he spoke and wrote about the relationship between science and religion.

From my point of view, it is comforting to know that someone so deeply rooted in science can believe in the same God of Jesus Christ that I believe in. A God who over 13.8 billion years shaped the universe that we now see, and over millions of years of evolution drew out the richness of flora and fauna that we see about us and even the humanity of which we are a part.

This is an awesome God, way beyond our understanding. I cannot even imagine the universe much less conceive a God able to create it.

In a debate with an atheist one of my other heroes, Archbishop Tom Wright said, "The God you don't believe in doesn't exist". At first I thought this was quite clever, any imagined god cannot be by the God who creates the universe. But the logical next statement is that the God that I do believe in does not exist either. Simply because any god that I can imagine could not have created all that we see around us.

As a Christian I believe that in Jesus Christ, God accommodates our limited imagination and shows us something of himself in a way that we can comprehend. But, as we read the Bible and try to understand what it means that this Christ was in some way instrumental in the very dawn of creation, we realise we can never be complacent about our limited imagined God.

During Lent this year we want to stretch that imagination. We will be meeting on Saturday mornings to explore the God who is revealed in Jesus Christ and also in the world around us. Whether you believe or don't, you would be most welcome.


