




Easter at All Saints

Between 2 and 3pm on Good Friday at All Saints we will have a time of reflection. We will be thinking about Jesus' terrible death on the cross and all that led up to it.

Why spend time thinking about something so gruesome? It was a perfect storm of evil. A coalition of Roman power and the Jewish religious authority had conspired to destroy the one person whose teaching and example could transform the world. And Jesus' friends (those who knew him best) deserted, denied and betrayed him.

But God didn't allow evil to be the last word. And so at 11:15am on Easter Day we will celebrate God's answer (for early risers there is also a dawn service at 5:30am at St Nicholas!); Jesus' resurrection.

All this gives me the most profound hope. God will not allow catastrophe and desolation to be the last words. This gives us the opportunity to face reality (political turmoil, war, and climate change amongst many) without becoming depressed and hopeless. But rather to accept the invitation to be part of God's transforming work.

Perhaps even more important it allows me to be realistic about myself. I know I am every bit as human as Jesus' first failed friends. But as there was hope for them and we too are offered hope of transformed lives in the Easter message.

Gardening at the School

We are pleased to be back again with the Gardening Club at the School and teaching some of the more enthusiastic how to grow their own food and flowers during their lunchtime. The Gardening Club have their own plot, and we use the troughs in the courtyard for both salad plants and flowers.

We have seeds to give the children from the Royal Horticultural Society Big Seed Sow, which hopefully will be of use to the allotments, and the new growing area, as well as the club.

Think we are spreading the seed too thin? Some of the packets have hundreds of seeds in, some only a few, but with a little help from our own seed swap at the Spring Show, we have quite a variety and should be able to provide most of what the "head gardeners" require.

We shall be planting up the potatoes for the class competition for the summer show again, and the seed grown in a pot. This year we are engaged with Little Darwin's as well so may be able to help them out with seeds and all the children growing their own "plant grown from seed".

The Society encourages young gardeners to take an interest in growing their own for eating. With the squeeze on finances every small plot, even a pot, can provide food. And some of the vegetables have lovely flowers!
