Rettendon Horticultural Society

It just starts to warm up but then, as I write, a week of cold nights and frost is predicted. It's very tempting to get started with planting out but the next couple of weeks is when tender plants are most vulnerable to damage. If you have moved some tender plants outside it's a good idea to have some fleece available ready to cover up. Any early potatoes showing above the soil are particularly at risk of frost damage.

We are getting ready for our annual plant sale on Saturday the 11th May between 10.30 and 12.30 at the village hall. As always local nurseries have been very generous and I can guarantee the availability of a large selection of plants at very reasonable prices. We are always grateful to receive any surplus plants that you may have.

On Tuesday the 21st May we have a talk at the village hall entitled Gardening the Globe. Start time is 7.30.

We are also taking bookings for our coach trip on Sunday the 30th June to Chelsworth Open Gardens. Chelsworth is a pretty village in Suffolk and on an annual basis at least 20 private gardens open to the public.
