Stay switched on - the Switch to Digital telephone lines How will the digital upgrade affect me?

For most people upgrading to digital services should be straightforward. Moving to a digital phone line means that your phone service will be delivered over the internet, similar to Zoom or Skype.

Where an Ultrafast Full Fibre broadband service is available you'll be upgraded from an analogue phone line to a digital one when you place an order and request a phone service or sign up to a new contract, whether you're changing provider, upgrading or re-grading.

By **31st January 2027** service providers will need to migrate most analogue telephone lines to digital phone lines. That's 7 million lines and channels across the UK. Some service providers may choose to upgrade their customers sooner, so you might see this reflected in their product offerings. We recommend that you check what's available on their website.

NOTE: For those with safety buttons to carers there may be some problems. Make sure you check with your care provider to ensure the switchover goes smoothly.
