On every side, ordinary every-day people are being annihilated in a tit-for-tat conflict which seems in danger of pulling ever more to join in. In God's Bible, Jesus warns us that there will be wars and rumours of wars as the world, as we know it, draws inevitably to a climatic end. Jesus came to live his life of example 2000 years ago. This is why Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for us, to take on board, the wrong-doing which is destroying our world, in order that we could be given a second chance, a renewed life, replacing an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, with a caring and love for our neighbour as of ourselves. Without the love and power of Jesus, our efforts cannot win. We only have to ask the Lord , Jesus Christ, to live with us in our lives , so that, with his strength we can stay on the side of right, kindness and in the promise of renewed live beyond our mortal death.
