





The first real frost of the Winter produced an overnight temperature of 2.8°C. No obvious plant damage was caused but with a few more night temperatures this low we should make sure that all tender plants are protected either by mulching or being brought under cover.

On the 22nd September our coach trip to Helmingham Hall Gardens and Dedham was well supported although not quite a full coach. It is very gratifying to have run two very successful coach outings this year. We are currently looking at venues for next year's trips.

On the 15th October we had a very interesting talk given by Emma Cannell on the subject of how lost gardens of interest are rediscovered and listed in area registers. Sadly the talk was only attended by nine people, six of which were committee members. Continued poor attendance may well sound the end of our once popular evening talks!

Our AGM, followed by seasonal treats, will take place on Tuesday 19th November at Rettendon Village Hall starting at 7.30. Everybody welcome.
