The insurance is being checked for the frequency of inspection.

Budget and Precept for 2025/2026

i Budget: the amount of money required by RPC for the expenditure for the next financial year. It is the law to agree a budget before a Parish Council can set its precept.

! Precept: the amount of money the Council ask for from CCC for the expenditure in the budget. Calculated from the Council Tax from the number of properties in the parish. The precept must be agreed by the end of the calendar year for CCC to calculate how much to charge each household next year.




