Hello Readers.

Before the year gets much older I'd just like to reflect on the big ticket item from April which we know as Easter. We have Christmas and New Year



then we all go back to work, school, etc. until Easter comes along, the Easter holiday for the school children, the Good Friday bank holiday. How many hot cross buns can we eat before someone says stop. Or, for the chocoholics, Easter eggs are the glorious way of indulging their passion. Easter is in springtime with the feelgood factor of spring flowers, green leaves on bushes and trees and the promise of summer sun.

Rettendon Parish Council Annual Meeting - Chairman's Report 13th May 2025

Good evening all. It is a pleasure to see you here this evening! We hope that you will want to share your thoughts with us rather than you just hearing from us.

There is no Agenda per sé because the meeting is specifically for you, the Parish. Just so that we are clear, what that means is that this is a residents meeting so you can talk with us, ask us questions and hold us to account. We are here to listen and try to solve any issues you bring to our attention.

Before that, I would like to give you a general overview of what we as a PC have been doing over the past 12 months.

I'd like to thank my fellow Parish Councillors who have continued to work hard this last year, they do the job voluntarily and always have this village and your best interest at the heart of what they try to achieve.

We also employed Emma Terris, as our new Clerk in July 2024. I am delighted to report that she has settled in very well and is enjoying being a part of this community.

Over the past 12 months, the following items are just a few things the PC with the help of some of you as parishioners or trustees have achieved.

I'll start with the Bell Fields.

The PC created a play area for the children of the parish as well as an adult fitness course and you will have seen that the trustees have added more play equipment and a picnic table there too. Those trustees are now coming to the end of their 4 year term of office.

The last 12 months have been eventful and as most of you know several tonnes of fly-tipped rubbish has been dumped on the Bell field car park area, due to the gate being left open. Trustees have also lost the football club hire, as a result a significant amount of funds has been lost, as well as the maintenance of the field which has been sadly neglected since.

However, three new trustees were appointed in April this year and since their arrival, the field has been cut in readiness for summer. We will be looking for volunteers to apply later this year as the old trustees finish their terms of office.

Sonters Down has been one of three neglected areas of the Parish and the 'Friends of Sonters Down' was established earlier last year with the help of a couple of Councillors, to act in an advisory capacity. Over the past 12 months or so, some of those friends have surveyed the Residents and sought to ask what the children wanted on their open space. We are happy to report that a Zip Wire was the choice and this is scheduled to begin installation after the school half term, so early June, and will be completed by the time Summer arrives. Councillors are delighted that we have been able to support residents and friends of Sonters Down in getting this done.

Remembrance Sunday once again was celebrated with Fran Theobald from the Living Memorial Centre presenting the Parish wreath on behalf of the community.

As you all know, the Village Memorial Hall is the focal point of the village and the volunteers continue to support the community in providing the warm hub throughout the cold winter months and provided hot soup and bread in a warm friendly environment. Several of the Parish Councillors were able to join in. And as last year will be continued throughout the warmer months as a Coffee, Cake and Salad session by popular demand. This is a perfect example of how the Memorial Hall Trustees manage the Hall and bring parishioners much needed support as well as different community events, Another example of their work in the community is the VE day celebrations they hosted last Saturday. Great food, great company and fantastic entertainment from the D-Day Dames.

It's is also pleasing that the once strained relationship between the Parish Council and Memorial Hall trustees is in the past. We are working together. The hall trustees agreed to allow the PC have their base at the Hall.

As you know the PC meetings are held on the last Tuesday of the month. All of you are invited to attend and we make these events as open and transparent as possible.

We have dealt with:

Community Safety:

Security Patrols: In response to rising concerns about local crime and limited police resources, the council decided on April 30, 2024, to continue its contract with S-Type Security. This service provides regular patrols across Rettendon, Battlesbridge, and Hayes Country Park, enhancing community safety.

Planning & Development:

Bell Public Car Park Proposal: On August 21, 2024, a re-submitted application for constructing a four-bedroom detached house in the Bell public house car park was noted. The council acknowledged significant public opposition and committed to representing residents' views in its response. Thankfully the application was withdrawn and the PC are in the process of applying for the Public House to become a valued community asset. We will keep you all informed.

Safety Campaigns: In July 2024, the council supported Essex County Fire and Rescue Service's summer safety campaign, advising residents on preventing wildfires and water-related incidents during the warmer months.

The Horticultural Show: is a major event of the village. Many of the parish councillors offer our support by helping out on the day in any way possible. It was again my pleasure to man the BBQ, with a great team of volunteers. I met many of you for the first time two years ago, and I look forward to meeting more of you this year too.

Our relationship with the Ward Councillors Paul Clark and Steve Davis continues to grow. They regularly attend our monthly meetings, keeping us informed about what's going on at City level and how it may affect our community.

We, with them, continue to hold Chelmsford and Essex to account on behalf of residents.
