



The Spring Show Trophy, currently held by Gabrielle Church, will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in Sections A - E.

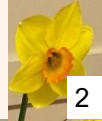
The Spring Show Platter will be awarded to the best exhibit in Sections A - E.

Section A: Daffodils Judge: Gerald Vale

1. One long trumpet daffodil bloom on one stem (trumpet as long or longer than the petals)
2. One short trumpet daffodil bloom on one stem (trumpet shorter than the petals)
3. One double daffodil bloom on one stem (double petals)
4. Two or more daffodil blooms on one stem
5. Three daffodil stems same variety
6. Three daffodil stems mixed or matched
7. Three stems miniature daffodils
8. Three stems daffodils not otherwise named in the schedule



Section E Vegetables Judge: Gerald Vale

23. Five shoots of sprouting broccoli
24. Three sticks of rhubarb trimmed
25. Any other vegetable grown in an exhibitor's garden or allotment

26. A pot of growing daffodils as from the bulb/bulbs distributed at last years Autumn Show
