Members' Area Privacy Policy

The Salonika Campaign Society (SCS) is committed to operating in compliance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). The SCS will hold all personal data securely in compliance with GDPR and will not provide this information to any outside organisation for any purpose unless required to do so by law.

Individuals may make a request via the SCS website to enquire what personal data is held about them. There will be no charge levied for valid requests and it is intended that all such requests are fulfilled within 30 working days of receipt.

Data held: name, contact details (email), and any information on your interest or connections with the campaign you have chosen to share with us.

Personal data held by the SCS at <https://e-voice.com/scs> is used solely to manage the content of this members' area.

More generally, embership data is retained for the duration of membership plus a suitable period to allow for lapsed memberships to be renewed. No membership data is retained later than 6 months after membership expires. Permission to hold an individual's personal data is deemed to be given to the SCS through any business transaction, or completion and submission of a membership application. The membership application form has a 'tick box' where permission to hold an individual's personal data may be denied, but in this case, the SCS will be unable to meet its membership objectives in providing services such as routine communications, membership renewal reminders and issue of publications such as The New Mosquito.

We would ask members to check the data we hold on them for accuracy, to advise us of any errors and also to update us with any changes.
