"I am very pleased to share my experiences of working with Sev Necati, and also experiencing her 10 week self defence course in Wembley Youth Centre in November 2015. I work as the Violence against women and girls prevention worker at Advance advocacy services. "Sev Necati worked to deliver personal safety training courses for women as part of the Tower Hamlets Warrior Women Training Programme.

The programme provided holistic personal safety training for women, including discussion based learning about issues such as domestic violence and sexual assault.
