Policy

- 1. All buildings, land and properties under the ownership or control of the Council will be visually inspected internally and externally on a six-monthly basis.
- 2. Additional inspections will be carried out following periods of inclement weather.
- 3. Details of inspections including dates carried out and faults found will be recorded in the property register and actioned in accordance with the Councils governance and procedures.
- 4. Where tenancy agreements exist, internal inspections will be carried out in accordance with the terms of the agreement or at intervals of not less than 12 months.
