FLORAL ART (Entries must be received 48 hours before show day)

Flowers etc need not have been grown by the Exhibitor. The use of artificial material is prohibited unless stated. Staged in niches 30" (75cm) x 40" (102cm) x 18" (46cm) deep (except class 43). All entries apart from Class 43 to be staged in Marble Place on Friday 25 October

- 41. Autumn's evening glow an exhibit to include a candle or candles
- 42. An invitation to dance an exhibit, title to be displayed

PETITE

- 43. Garden Glow (10" (25cm) width, 10" (25cm) depth, height optional)
- INTERMEDIATE (Demonstrators, teachers and florists not eligible)
- 44. Bonfire Night an exhibit **Staged in niches 30" (75cm) x 40" (102cm) x 18" (46cm) deep**
- NOVICE (Demonstrators, teachers and florists not eligible)
- 45. Seasonal splendour an exhibit Staged in niches 30" (75cm) x 40" (102cm) x 18" (46cm) deep
- **PUMPKINS** Need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
- Children aged 12 or under on the date of the show
- 48. A decorated pumpkin to include foliage and berries. Candles not permitted.
- We recommend that all children are supervised by a parent or carer .

Adults

- 49. Autumn colours in a pumpkin. Using a pumpkin as a container.
- 50. An Autumn arrangement in a hollowed-out pumpkin with no more than 10 stems of seasonal foliage, berries, seedheads and flowers from the exhibitor's garden.

- 7. 3 vases of 3 blooms of any variety in each vase
- 8.3 Incurved
- 9.3 Intermediate
- 10. 3 Reflexed
- 11. 2 vases of 2 blooms per vase excluding section 1 or 2
- 12. 2 stems Spray
- 13. 3 stems Spray
- 14. 3 stems or blooms of any section not previously mentioned

CHRYSANTHEMUMS NOVICE CLASSES

- 15. 3 blooms any variety
- 15a. 1 bloom any variety

SPECIAL CLASSES No more than 10 stems in classes 38 and 39

- 24. Sponsored chrysanthemum grown in pot maximum 6" (15cm) diameter37. A handled basket of chrysanthemums with any foliage. To be viewed from the front only and judged for decorative effect. Exhibitors to provide baskets which must be capable of being lifted by the handles without disturbing the arrangement.38. A vase of mixed seasonal foliage/berries/seedheads
- 39. A vase of seasonal foliage and garden flowers
- 40. A vase of 5 stems of garden flowers
