

Founded in 2009 The Stoke Poges Society aim has been from the outset to preserve our ancient village's history and heritage and to foster interest in our locality.

Our varied programme for 2024 includes talks, visits and members' social events.

The Society is keen to encourage members to research their own family, or road, or any other aspect of the village that interests them, and share their findings with other members of the Society.

We make available archive material to members and people around the world. In recent years much of our archive has been digitized so is easier to share.

### Education to the early 20th century

One of the earliest records of education is of Mary Salter of Stoke Court leaving in her will, dated in 1716, £100 for the education of the poor children of the Parish.

A Charity Trust school was operating in the mid-18th century. In 1876, the elementary school in School Lane opened which subsequently became part of the State primary school: The Stoke Poges School in Rogers Lane.

In 1830, St James Classical Catholic Academy moved to Baylis House. It closed in 1907. Rafael Merry del Val Cardinal, Secretary of State under Pope Pius X attended there.

Stoke House school was running in the 1830s through to 1913 when it moved to the Sussex coast. It was a private boys boarding preparatory school. Nearly all of the boys gained scholarships to the top 'public' boys boarding schools in England.
