The application is now live on the planning portal. As we feared, the number of houses has increased from 50 to 70, with the nursing home etc dropped. It is a huge estate compared to the other 3.

After this we are hosting 2 drop-in sessions for those who need help with the technology. We will have laptops and for those people we can upload their comments directly via the village hall wifi. The drop-in sessions are Monday 18th November 12 noon-6pm and Wednesday 20th November 6pm-9pm.

We do not know who has bought the field next to the pastures, along Tilstock Lane near the railway bridge.
