How much is it if I buy a tea set and a rocking horse?

Tea set: shilling - 12 pence

Rock Horse: florin - 40 pence

Total: 52 pence

2.

I have a shilling. If I buy a dolly and a dolls bed, will I get any change?

Dolly: 6 pence

Bed: 1 pence

Shilling (12 pence)

Change: 5 pence

3.

I have a Penny. If I buy a spinning top how much change will I get?

Spin top: half penny

Change: half penny

4.

I have a six pence. If I buy marbles and a train, will I get change?

Marbles: farthing (4 pennies in a farthing)

Train: Groat (4 pennies)

Total: 4 and a quarter pence

Change: YES

5.

I have a groat. If I buy a dolls bed, how much change will I get?

Bed: 1 pence

Groat is 4 pence

Change: 3 pence

6.

I have 2 shillings. If I buy rocking horse, will I get change?

Rock Horse: costs a florin

A florin is the same as 2 shilling.

No change

7.

I have a sixpence. Can I afford to buy a skipping rope and a yoyo?

Skipping: 3 pence

Yoyo: farthing ($\frac{1}{4}$ pence)

Total: $3 \frac{1}{4}$ pence

YES you can

8.

I have a shilling. If I buy a tea set, how much change will I get?

Tea set: shilling

No Change

9.

I have a shilling. If I buy a spinning top and a dolly, how much change will I get?

Spin top: halfpenny ($\frac{1}{2}$)

Doll: 6 pence

Shilling = 12 pence

Change: 5 and half pence

10.

I have a threepenny bit in my pocket. If I found a lucky penny on the floor, could I afford to buy a train?

3 pence + 1 penny = 4 pence

Train: Groat (same as 4 pence)

YES I can
