

Boost for High Wycombe's homeless after Highcrest Academy students vote to support them

Homeless people in High Wycombe have been given a boost after students at The Highcrest Academy voted to make them their charity of the year. Pupils chose Wycombe Homeless Connection to be this year's beneficiary. Every year, Highcrest selects a different local charity and then works to raise money for it.

A delighted James Boultbee, Chief Executive Officer of Wycombe Homeless Connection (WHC), said: "We're honoured and grateful to have been chosen to be supported by the students and staff at Highcrest. It's been an incredibly tough year for everyone, but especially for people in our community who have no home, or are facing losing the roof over their head. By supporting our work, and raising awareness of what we can do, Highcrest students are making a real and long-lasting difference."

WHC is a local charity that helps people who are homeless, and increasingly focuses on preventing people from losing their homes in the first place. As well as its frontline support services, it runs a homelessness prevention hotline which gives anyone who needs access to free, independent advice and support.

WHC was one of three charities shortlisted by the High Wycombe school. Each one of them sent in a video which students across the academy watched in classes. A voting form was then sent around the school, and WHC was declared the outright winner. The initiative has run every year since 2013.

Last year, the school's chosen charity was Wycombe Women's Aid (WWA) where more than £1.500 was raised.

Normally, the academy runs a number of events such as bag packs, cake sales and non-uniform days. This year, staff and students will have to adapt. Mr Clarke added: "Obviously this is a bit more of a challenge this year as the fundraising

will have to stay in the vear group 'bubbles'. However, we still hope to be able to raise an amount that will make a difference to WHC this year." So far this term, Highcrest has already raised £1,000 for WHC.

Rennie Grove provides end of life care for adults, care for children with life limiting illnesses in Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire and runs a day care hospice in St Albans. They provide nursing care and support to families every day of the year at no cost to the patient. This is an expensive service to run and only 12% of the running costs are met by the NHS, the remainder being provided by fundraising and bequests. Prior to Hazels' very informative talk we held our Annual Meeting, welcoming three new ladies onto our Committee for the coming year.

Our November Meeting marked Wycombe Wenches 9th Birthday, we had party hats, balloons and birthday banners as our backgrounds for the zoom meeting, but sadly could not share the birthday cake we normally consume in November! Our meeting had a practical activity this month, members had all received a card making kit and set about making a Special 3D Christmas Card under our Presidents leadership.

South Bucks Hospice at Butterfly House Outpatient care enhancing quality of life *Remember, you are not alone in your grief*?





A Light Up A Life service is normally held at Christmas at South Bucks Hospice to allow people to remember the loved ones they have lost. But, this year, coronavirus has made it impossible for the event to go ahead in the traditional way. Juliette Coffey, Head of Individual and Family Support at the hospice, explains here how the public can still take part in this important service from the safety of their own homes.

It is usually about this time of year that we contact you to invite you to come and join with us to attend our annual *Light Up A Life* event at Butterfly House, the home of South Bucks Hospice in High Wycombe. At this deeply-poignant service, we think about loved ones who have made such a difference in our lives, loved ones who we treasured in life, and will always treasure. In joining together, we celebrate our loved ones lives but we also share in a community spirit of supporting one another.

Although, our building has been closed recently due to the COVID-19 19 pandemic, our thoughts are very much with you. Even if we do manage to partially re-open before Christmas, it would clearly not be safe during this pandemic to hold our traditional Light Up a Life service in the building. We invite you, though, in your separate homes this year, to light up a light over Christmas and remember our loved ones and the support that we have in our community.

Please know that you are not alone in your grief - we are here to help you. Even if our doors are not currently open, if any of you have lost a loved one from cancer, and are struggling, please reach out and ask for telephone or video link support from one of our counselling team. Or perhaps you would like to join one of our bereavement support groups starting from April next year.

Normally when I write in the winter issue of Totteridge & Terriers News I am thinking about the things we share at this time of year – the change in the seasons, preparations for Christmas and so on. This year is different, and there is no doubt the impact coronavirus has had on our lives.

Although I am writing this before the vote is held in Parliament, I expect some restrictions to be lifted following the four-week November

lockdown. The Prime Minister is anxious to contain the autumn surge of people testing positive for COVID, protect the NHS and save lives and livelihoods, but the restrictions have to be balanced against the long-term effect on business, jobs, physical and mental health. It is important to remember the NHS continues to be available for non-Covid healthcare, so people should not be afraid to use the NHS for scans and treatment if they need it.

In early November I and some other Conservative MPs who voted against the autumn lockdown formed the *Covid Recovery Group* to bring a rounded view – based on informed scientific, economic and health data - to the debate surrounding the response to the virus. We all know lockdowns have a cost, whether in deteriorating mental health, higher suicide rates and missed A&E appointments – not to mention the impact it has on young people's education, job prospects and our soaring debts. The Group's principles are to undertake and publish full cost-benefit analysis of restrictions on a regional basis; to end the monopoly on advice of government scientists, allowing competitive multi-disciplinary expert groups to shape the debate; and significantly to boost the performance of NHS Test and Trace by shifting resources to local public health teams to lead contact tracing, breaking the chain of transmission.

The Covid Recovery Group will play its part in helping the government to deliver an enduring strategy for living with the virus, so that we break the transmission of the disease, command public support, end this cycle of repeated restrictions and start living in a sustainable way until an effective and safe vaccine is successfully rolled out across the population. The announcement that there is likely to be a vaccine by the end of the year has shifted the country's outlook. If a safe and effective vaccine can be given, then we can hope life returns to normal much faster.

Many of us have had to learn to embrace technology, talking to our friends and family by phone and on the internet rather than meeting in person. Zoom, Microsoft Teams and the traditional telephone has meant I have been able to continue to speak to constituents, sometimes singly and sometimes in groups. It has actually allowed me to offer more meetings and greater flexibility to constituents, especially those who might otherwise find it difficult to come to my office due to work, health, childcare or other reasons.
