

### Latest news from Scannappeal, proud to support Bucks NHS hospitals.

Launch of our new Mobile Breast Screening Appeal Working in partnership with Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust Charitable Funds we have launched a £410,000 appeal mobile to provide a new, fully equipped, state-of-the-art mobile breast screening mammography screening unit. As part of a major upgrade of mobile mammography across Bucks, and with a new unit due to start screening in November for the north of the county, this appeal aims to fully fund a much-needed new unit for South Bucks. Breast screening is essential in detecting early signs of cancer, often identifying small changes in breast tissue before other symptoms appear.

By improving accessibility to these vital cancer screening services, we aim to encourgae more women to undergo screening, which can lead to earlier detection and ultimately save more lives.

# Terriers W.I.

After our summer break, we had a high attendance at our September meeting, we also welcomed visitors and guests who we hope will join us.

After catching up on WI news and events, our speaker David Gantzel spoke to us on the life of Charles Dickens. David has a vast knowledge on the life and times of one of our best-known authors. Born in Portsmouth in 1812, Dickens's own life was just as colourful as many of his characters. He travelled to Italy, Switzerland, North America, and Canada. Many of Dickens's characters were inspired from people who he had met as a child as well as an adult.

For our October meeting Geoff Pegg from The Crime Prevention and Neighbourhood Watch Team. Spoke to us on how to protect ourselves and our homes, during the dark winter evenings. There are simple and effective things we can all do to keep safe. He also gave us examples of scams that can look and sound genuine, they could be phone calls, texts or emails asking for personal information or our bank details. Everyone has encountered someone trying to scam them, and we all need to be vigilant and to stop and think, but scammers are always looking for new and convincing ways to scam us, Geoff gave out pamphlets and information cards on how to report crimes and prevent being scammed. At the end of October our President held a coffee morning at her home in Terriers. We all enjoyed a relaxing morning.

In November Angela Hougham spoke to us on how she was inspired to raise money for the Alzheimer's Society, a charity that urgently needs more funding, due to an increase of cases in the younger generation as well as the older members of the community. Angela decided to walk the British Coastal Path. Unfortunately, the Covid lock downs prevented her from keeping to the original plans, but in 2021 she managed to complete her challenge, at the end of her walk she had walked 2,500 miles and raised over £70,000. Angela is still raising money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Society. And has won the BBC Three Counties Radio Fund Raising Award



### Memory Partners Charity

The last edition of T&T News gave details of our tai chi cafés in Totteridge and Beaconsfield.
