# Terriers W.I.

**September\_** Our speaker was Ken Brazier who spoke to us on his fund raising for Mercy Ships. Mercy Ships is a faith-based international development organisation that deploys hospital ships to some of the poorest countries in the world, delivering vital, free healthcare to people in desperate need. This included Ken traveling to Tanzania and walking to the top of Kilimanjaro where he raised sixteen thousand pounds. Kilimanjaro is a large dormant volcano in Tanzania. It is the highest mountain in Africa and the highest free-standing mountain above sea level in the world, at 5,895 m (19,341 ft) above sea level.



October – We welcomed back Louise Donavan a Local Wildlife Photographer, who gave us an insight on how she photographs wild birds and animals. Louise went to Greece, were she managed to take photos of dalmatian Pelican's diving for food over the sea. She also went to the west coast of Scotland to Mull, Iona, & Lunga, where she was able to spend time with our coastal birds and was able to take clear close-up photos of birds including Crakes, Puffins and Egens.

November – Local Historian Mike Dewey, our speaker, brought a collection of photographs he described how the residents of High Wycombe spent their leisure time from 1909 when the first electric light show opened to the opening of the Swan Theatre in 1992. Many of the old photographs of High Wycombe remain and we can still recognise some of the buildings today. Before 1939 Wycombe had 4 Cinemas, many of us remembered going to the Palace and Odeon cinemas during the 1960's and 1970's . We were surprised to hear that there was an indoor swimming pool in Frogmore, it was filled with cold water from the River Wye and was only open in the summer months and later boarded over for roller skating.

Wycombe Show held on the Rye was mainly a county fair with cattle and sheep, and tug of war competitions. Members were amazed to hear of an annual Air Shows that were held on the land which is now Wycombe High School, where planes, would take passengers on short flights around High Wycombe. This is how the Society has so many historical photos taken from the air in their collection.

# Scams & Cons.....They are everywhere!

In recent weeks it seems like the scammers have upped their game. Whether it be on the phone or by the e-mail they are there to catch you off guard. Having done so with a claim of a refund, a large payment from somewhere or an investment you may or may not have made they are out to get your money not refund it to you. Once your bank details and other information has been obtained the only route is likely to be the loss of your money. Any thoughts of receiving money into your bank account is very unlikely.

#### Just some of the current scams.....

A caller, usually automated informs you there has been a couple of unusual transactions on your bank account. One of these will often will be for a large amount of money, the other an international transaction. They invite you to press 1 to cancel or 2. to speak to an agent. DO NEITHER, hang the phone up!

A caller usually live calls to tell you there is a Crypto wallet with your name on it. You apparently invested in this maybe by clicking a link on a web site with a deposit of £250.00. The question is to whom? They don't know the answer because this never happened. The wallet is worth (Example) £23,000.00 and they want to return this to you. They will not do a cheque (of course not) but want your bank details so you can be credited. DO NOT GIVE OUT ANY DETAILS AND HANG UP!

A caller calls supposedly in response to your request to invest from a web site. You have of course done no such thing and perhaps worryingly they have harvested your phone number and e-mail likely as the result of a data breach somewhere. Again DO NOT GIVE OUT ANY DETAILS AND HANG UP!

A caller claims to be your local energy advisor. While some of these calls may be from genuine companies there are plenty of fraudsters out there to replicate them. Even the genuine ones don't really have your interest at heart, they are there to make money both from any grants they can obtain and any extras you will have to pay them for. AVOID THEM AND HANG UP!

These are just a few of the scams that are out there. There are many aimed at specific groups such as young or older people. If an offer sounds to good to be true it probably is. Hang up or walkaway is the best advice.

# Emma Revnolds MP

It was a privilege to attend the Remembrance Sunday Parade and Service at the All Saints Parish Church War Memorial in High Wycombe. We gathered with thanksgiving and sorrow to honour all those who have laid down their lives in wars and conflicts. As we reflect on their courage and sacrifice, I welcome the Government's new Defence Housing Strategy, launched earlier this year. This landmark £9 billion investment will deliver modern, high-quality homes fit for our heroes. More than 40,000 military homes will be upgraded, including many right here in Buckinghamshire. I am proud to serve in a Government that has already delivered the largest pay rise for Armed Forces personnel in over 20 vears.

Earlier this year Butterfly House in Totteridge received £57,314 in July 2025 by Department of Health and Social Care to upgrade its facilities. During Hospice Care Week, I was delighted to visit Butterfly House, which provides an outstanding range of services to improve people's quality of life. From physiotherapy and bereavement support groups to creative arts and crafts activities, the team at Butterfly House go above and beyond to support local families. Their work embodies compassion and community spirit at its best.

Throughout my election campaign and my first year as Wycombe's MP, I have been clear that we must not lose any services from Wycombe Hospital. I therefore welcome the announcement from Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust regarding their submission of plans for a new landmark building at the Wycombe Hospital site, which marks an exciting new chapter for local healthcare. Earlier this month I met with the new CEO to protect vital local NHS services.

Like many local residents, I am deeply concerned about the state of our rivers and waterways. Pollution and sewage spills are unacceptable, and this is an issue I am determined to tackle in my role as Environment Secretary. The government has recently announced the introduction of automatic penalties, similar to speeding tickets, so that water companies face swift consequences when they break the rules.

It was a real pleasure to meet so many constituents at the Christmas light switch on. I'd like to take this opportunity to wish all readers of Totteridge and Terriers News a very Merry Christmas and a joyful New Year.

## The Past



Wycombe Food Hub was formed in 2020, at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, as an emergency response to growing food insecurity in High Wycombe. It started with volunteers rescuing surplus food to support vulnerable families. Since then, we've evolved into a grassroots solution to food waste and community hunger. We've redistributed over 70 tonnes of surplus food per month, thanks to the commitment of local residents, community leaders, and partner organisations. Our work continues to reduce food waste and support those facing food poverty.

#### The Present

Today, Wycombe Food Hub is a vital community resource. We intercept food from 90 suppliers – supermarkets, restaurants, wholesalers, farms, and local growers. We provide low-cost, nutritious food to those who need it most, while promoting sustainability through repair Hub, community growing, and educational initiatives. We also support people beyond food – offering financial advice, signposting services, and social connection. Our team, made up of local volunteers and supported by partners, is committed to tackling poverty, isolation, and inequality in High Wycombe.

#### The Future

By the end of 2025, we must relocate from our current base. But with change comes opportunity. We are planning a new, permanent home for Wycombe Food Hub – one that

- A food warehouse and community kitchen
- Dedicated spaces for education, growing, and repair

Accessible community support services. This move will expand our impact and enable long-term, sustainable support for the people of High Wycombe.

### The Dream

Our long-term vision is a High Wycombe where no one goes hungry, and nothing goes to waste. We aim to build a circular, community-led food system powered by:

- Kindness, cooperation, and local action
- Practical solutions to food and fuel poverty

A model that inspires other communities to act

Together, we can make High Wycombe greener, fairer, and more connected.

# Crackdown on misuse of disabled permits

Buckinghamshire Council recently carried out another successful Blue Badge Day of Action targeting misuse of disabled parking permits across the county.

The latest operation was held on 28th October with 163 badges checked across Aylesbury, Beaconsfield and Gerrards Cross. During the checks three expired badges were seized although in each case the holder had a valid replacement but had failed to remove the old one. Five penalty charge notices were issued.

Please make sure you check your badge is valid and in date and only used by the badge holder.

# Waiting times for Education, Health and Care Plan assessments targeted

An extra investment of £3 million in a recovery plan to cut waiting times for Education, Health and Care Assessments (EHCPAs) are part of the council's commitment to improving support for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

Along with other UK wide authorities Buckinghamshire Council has seen a significant rise in demand in recent years of 12%. To address these challenges, to ensure all children and young people in Buckinghamshire with SEND can access the support they need in a timely way and support families the council has agreed an action plan.

The £3 million will go towards recruitment and retention, streamlining application processes, enhancing family support and monitoring and accountability measures.

Are you still using Windows 10?
Is your computer not suitable for Windows 11?

There are still free security updates for Windows 10 for consumers, ie home users. Here is how to get Microsoft's Extended Security Updates for Windows 10 until October 2026:

- 1. Make sure you have Windows 10 version 22H2. To see which Windows 10 version you have, click Start menu -> Settings -> System -> About. If you have an older version of Windows 10, click Start menu -> Settings -> Update & Security -> Windows Updates -> Check for updates.
- 2. Make sure you have signed in to Windows 10 as an Administrator with a Microsoft Account. The Microsoft Account type must be an adult account, not a child account. To check, click Start menu -> Settings -> Accounts. It should say you have an Administrator account. It should say "Manage my Microsoft Account".
- 3. If it says "Local account", click "Sign in with a Microsoft Account instead". I have found that if you are using a Local Account, it will ask if you want to pay £24.99 to get the Extended Security Updates.
- 4. Click Settings -> Update & Security -> Windows Update. Under Extended Security Updates, click "Enrol now".
- 5. Enter the email address that was used to sign up for a Microsoft Account and the password for the Microsoft Account.

I have had to do steps 4 and 5 twice to get to the success screen. On the first attempt, I got "Something went wrong" followed by "We can't enrol you in Extended Security Updates right now. Close this window and try again". I don't



know why it did that, but then it worked on the second attempt.

After doing this, it will help to keep your computer virus-free, but it is only a temporary measure. Did this help? Let me know! Phil 07904 125648
