

# Highcrest students praised after wowing audience during USA work placement

Two teenagers from The Highcrest Academy won lavish praise during a 'once-in-a-lifetime' work placement trip to America attended by students from all around the world. Ellie Millward-Roberts and Linchy Pakeerathan, both 17, returned to the High Wycombe school this autumn after impressing a large audience in the USA with their presentation skills.



The sixth formers were part of a group of students from across the globe to take part in the 2019 Alliance Building and

Training Session in New Brunswick. This is an annual event organised by healthcare company Johnson & Johnson (J&J), which has headquarters in High Wycombe. The pair secured their places through the Bridge to Employment (BTE) programme which was set up by J&J in 1992 to inspire young people to enrol in higher education, excel academically and pursue health and science careers.

Darshini Sharma, J&J's BTE Lead for High Wycombe, who accompanied Ellie and Linchy on the trip, said: "Both girls wholeheartedly embraced every challenge presented to them and we are delighted to have been able to give them this opportunity".

As part of the sessions, Ellie and Linchy worked in teams with students from other countries to re-imagine heritage J&J products; interviewing industry professionals from the company to learn about different aspects of product development and to hone their professional skills. They then had to present their product to an audience of more than 150 people, including senior executives from J&J.

The countries represented included Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Ireland, Israel, Mexico, New Zealand, Singapore, Puerto Rico, South Africa, Sweden and various American states and cities.

The High Wycombe students were supported by several UK-based professionals from J&J who have worked with them as part of the BTE programme. The pair left the UK on October 1 and before heading back to the UK on October 6, there was just enough time for a flying visit to New York City where the Highcrest students went on a river cruise along the New York coastline, visited the 9/11 Memorial, had a sightseeing tour of Manhattan and ate at Ellen's Stardust Diner where Broadway singers entertain diners with songs from musicals.





# Santa's unwanted gifts can help hospice patients

Patients with life-limiting conditions could benefit from donations of unwanted goods from people who

receive bumper gifts in their Christmas stocking.

South Bucks Hospice, based at Butterfly House, High Wycombe, is appealing to the public to donate items such as clothing, books and bric-a-brac which will then be sold in the charity and re-use shops to raise funds for patient care.

Ben O'Keefe, Community Fundraiser at the hospice, explained: "It could be that you received a gift you didn't want or didn't really need. Or it might be that you are clearing out some of your children's old toys in readiness for some new ones from Santa. "So rather than leave the new presents unopened in a corner, or the old toys in a bin, why not give it to us so we can resell it?"

He added: "As well as our shops in Hazlemere and Bourne End, we also have two re-use shops based at the Household Recycling Centres at High Heavens in High Wycombe and Aston Clinton. Items such as electricals, bulkier sports goods and furniture for example which cannot be sold through the shops are welcomed here and are sold to support the hospice. These shops are both based at the household recycling centres to make it easier for residents to deliver re-usable items to the shops whilst they are dropping off unusable items for recycling and disposal - they are hugely popular with customers looking for a bargain."

Steve Longdon from FCC Environment, which runs Buckinghamshire County Council's household recycling centres throughout the county, said: "We operate around 100 such sites up and down the country and Buckinghamshire was one of the first counties to

introduce site re-use shops, which support a good cause and at the same time highlight the environmental importance of re-use. The shops really make it easy for residents to drop items off for re-sale and our staff are trained to spot great items too so everyone wins."

To donate an item, drop into the hospice shops at either Hazlemere, Bourne End, High Heavens or Aston Clinton or phone 01494 552750 for more information. The hospice helps people with progressive, life-threatening or terminal illnesses and provides a range of support services to assist families and patients.



### I hear you knocking but you can't come in

Beware of the Nottingham Knockers. That's the warning from Neighbourhood Watch. If you come across them let the police know as soon as possible about this unsavoury bunch. While outwardly they can appear respectable they are unscrupulous and tend to target the elderly and vulnerable.

They get there name because traditionally they travel to an area from the East Midlands by mini-bus accompanied by a Team Leader. Usually they go door-to-door selling cleaning materials. Some of them are honest but their real aim is to assess the area and each house to pass back information to their leader. Properties are often targeted for burglary soon after with elderly people at the highest risk.

Remember most people who call at your home will be genuine. However, some will turn up and try to trick their way in. There is a simple way to prevent this: If you don't know them, don't let them in. Always ask for proof of identity and leave them outside while you check. A genuine caller will be happy for you to do this.


