

Would you like more

- Say in the public services you receive?
- Involvement in decisions taken on local issues?
- Tailored services that better meet your local communities' needs?
- Access to local services?
- Action from public organisations to make a real difference to you and your community?

If the answer to one or more of these questions is yes, then you may like to know that the local councils in your area are meeting in public on a regular basis to work on matters of importance to your local community. In High Wycombe Buckinghamshire County Council, in partnership with Wycombe District Council have set up a Local Community Partnership (LCP) which meets every 3 months to take action on issues which matter to local people. Other partners are also working with us such as Thames Valley Police, Bucks Fire and Rescue, local Health providers and Buckinghamshire New University. This is part of the wider Pathfinder initiative which seeks to integrate the work of County and District Councils and create efficiencies, whilst still retaining the individual organisations.

The LCP can influence decisions about how money is spent locally, how to target services better for local people, what to prioritise in your area and has some money for local projects.

Local people are welcome to come along . We have an open door policy, with time set aside for public questions at every meeting. If you would like to ask a question or get an item added to the agenda please contact your Area Co-ordinator, Madeleine Howe email mphowe@buckscc.gov.uk

The LCP is a new way for the councils to work with local communities and would welcome any thoughts on how this can be improved. From the experience of earlier meetings we will be managing the public question time fairly so that everyone who has sent in a question has the opportunity to have it discussed at the meeting.

At the last meeting two locals residents' groups – Bassetsbury Allotment Holders Association and Heart of Ryemead Community Association - attended with questions and issues of concern and we were able to provide responses to these in writing following the meeting.

The two councils are working on other ways in which you can take part in local democracy on a much more local basis and have input into these meetings. You will be hearing more about this work in a future edition. As part of the Pathfinder work we are exploring how the Public Sector bodies can meet in your area and have a single conversation with local people. This is being trialled in the Downley and Disraeli area and a rural area of the District. This is currently being evaluated and a decision taken on how this can be best taken forward across the District. There are also many other ways of local people and communities getting their voices heard, such as contacting their local Councillors, responding to consultations, organising a petition to present to either council or the Local Community Partnership, or asking a question at relevant District Council or County Council meetings.

Neighbourhood Watch Week

Neighbourhood Watch Week coincides this year with the Wycombe District Neighbourhood Watch Association's Crime Prevention event. This will take place on Saturday 20th June from 9am until 4pm in the Eden Shopping Centre. The stand will be located near the entrance to Tesco and is being staged under the banner of the Wycombe Community Safety Partnership. Organisations taking part include Thames Valley Police, WDC Community Safety Department, Trading Standards, Bucks Fire and Rescue, Handy Van Scheme, Anchor Safer Housing and Neighbourhood Watch.

New Play Time Funds

Wycombe District Council has successful in applying for an award of £200,000 in funding from the Department of Children, Schools and Families (DCSF) to build exciting new children's playgrounds and recreation areas in Castlefield and Princes Risborough. The council is hoping for a further award next year of £209,000 to work on another four sites.

That June evening Dad had gone to do his regular ARP duties with his Hillside mate, Bill Woodley. It was still daylight and there was no need to check the neighbourhood's blackout. So they made their way straight to their concrete shelter in Totteridge Road (Bowerdean Crossroads), where latyer St Mark's Church—and now a mosque—would stand. They would take it in turns to sleep. But not tonight!

Mum and I were preparing for an early night. She was tired and I had a busy day ahead at school (RGS) - which in fact never happened (too much broken glass for the caretakers to cope with!). The strange heavy, chugging, motorbike-like sound from the sky above Totteridge Hill sent us rushing to the back windows. Through the distant tress we could make out the silhouette of a narrow, ugly object. As we watched, the engine stopped. A few moments later came the loudest bang possibly ever heard in the area.

People rushed out of their houses and now Dad and Bill, armed with an authority which they had never enjoyed before, ordered everyone to stay indoors, while they hurried over the rough, steep scrubland (now Adelaide Road). In a field (now Totteridge Recreation Ground) they found a large, smoking crater—and one dead cow. Geralds Road bore the brunt of the blast and the glaziers were kept busy in that area (including the church, schools and shops) for many a day afterwards.

East Wycombe's peace was eventually restored but some of us have been a bit jumpy ever since! More (V1) flying-bombs landed in nearby villages over the next few weeks but fortunately for us the supersonic (V2) rockets, whose approach was heard AFTER they had landed, never reached this area. Not even the special folk in Bassetsbury Lane would have survived one of them!

Soon the Dutch launch-sites were overrun by the Allies and the devastation ceased. The interesting question is what might have happened to the outcome of the war, if the Germans had discovered these weapons earlier. We might easily have lost the war...... But let put away such dismal thoughts and enjoy the present day peace and calm of the Bowerdean Valley, while we can!

AN UNWELCOME TOTTERIDGE VISITOR

It is 65 years since the big bang shocked—and in some cases shook—our area. It came at the end of a sunny June 20th Day in 1944. A fortnight earlier (D-Day) Allied Forces had re-entered Europe and now the Germans were retreating from France and the other occupied countries.

A year later (VE-Day) would see the end of a war which had devastated many cities, including London, but had left High Wycombe (not that far away) untroubled—apart from the occasional surplus bomb dropped in Kings wood by German planes returning from a night raid. In this fifth year of the Second World War we were not looking for trouble to come from the skies. We were wrong and although there were no casualties, we felt quite indignant at this unexpected intrusion!

How we escaped up to then, has puzzled some of us ever since. Bomber Command was based at Naphill (Walter's Ash) where raids on Germany were planned; American forces were stationed at the (requisitioned) Abbey School and Dawes Hill; Hughenden Manor was the centre of map-production for the RAF; Booker Airport was kept busy training glider pilots to drop behind enemy lines; many factories in the area had switched from furniture to fighter plane production; tanks were regularly tested on the hills above Broom and Wade's (later Compair) engineering works in Bellfields.

Were there no enemy spies and if there were, why were they so ineffective—or were they just ignored? My mother knew the reason! The talented Mitford family lived in Bassetsbury Lane. Hitler was on friendly terms with at least one of them. She made him promise not to hurt her family or "the neighbours". The whole of Rowan Avenue where we lived, believed this story. So while we listened nightly to the racket of bombs and anti-aircraft guns and saw the flames and smoke rising above London, we were able to relax—until that June night.

For not even Hitler could protect Wycombe from flying-bombs, which went wherever they wished. Nicknamed "doodle-bugs", in 1944 they began to be fired from launch pads in Holland. They had not pilot and chugged their noisy way across south-east England, until their fuel ran out and they plunged to earth.

Courts in Action

Wycombe Magistrates' Court invites the public to watch court proceedings accompanied by magistrates who will explain what is happening. These escorted court visits take place 4 times a year from 9.30 am to 12.30 pm. Places are limited so reservations are required. The next one is scheduled for Monday 13 July.

During the morning visitors will spend some time in the public seating area of the courts. The courts may be dealing with a bail application, sentencing an offender or conducting a trial. There will also be time available outside the court room to discuss the cases with the magistrates who will be accompanying you.

Most visitors have never been in a magistrates' court before and find the whole experience fascinating and want to see more, which they can do. Adult criminal courts are open to the public every day.

The advantage of the escorted court visit is that visitors are accompanied by magistrates who will answer questions and thereby increase understanding of the proceedings.
