





After 23 years as the founder and Honorary Secretary of Totteridge (youth) FC the time has come for me to hang up my notepad & biro and gracefully retire because of ongoing health issues.

It was my eldest son who first begged me to keep the team together after the club he was playing for folded back in 1996, so came about the formation of Totteridge FC where since then in my role of club secretary I have processed 1,523 registrations from 671 players (including a fair few girls) with the teams winning 5 fairplay awards and 26 competitions along the way culminating in two cup finals played at senior non-league grounds in front of 100's of paying spectators.

In that time I have attended 250 club meetings, numerous league meetings, a county disciplinary hearing and written god knows how many documents & spreadsheets but it is the people I've met along the way who have kept it all so interesting, strangely that includes a phone call out of the blue from a casting director saying they are filming in Totteridge and looking for some young footballers aged between 10 and 12 to appear in a TV commercial for Nisa Supermarket. What's more, each player that appeared would get £180.00 for their time! WOW!! - fame, fortune and stardom!! .... until I realised he meant Totteridge in north London!! - (that was not the only time we've been mistaken for the other Totteridge). More seriously, it has been an absolute privilege to get know and work with so many good people from within the community who have freely given up their time for the benefit of the local youngsters, so they could continue to enjoy their passion – football. I'm sure if I were thank everyone individually who at some time or other were involved with the club I could fill the pages of this magazine, so here's a mass personal grateful thanks to you all. Following with me through from the very beginning of this adventurous voyage has been Eric Chapman, co-founder and Chairman; my right hand man; the vin to my yang; the cautious to my optimism and together I think we have made a pretty good job of keeping the good ship HMS TFC afloat across the seas of time. Together we have enjoyed many successful times and steadied the boat through the some choppy waters for that many years that we are now seeing the children of the children who first played for us. It has been an absolute pleasure getting to know so many of players and watching them grow and mature into proud & respected members of our community.

We will be holding our annual awards ceremony down at the High Wycombe Cricket Club on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> June starting about 4:30 p.m. and if there is anyone who has served with the club in any capacity during my tenure then please do come down and say hello ... or should that be good-bye?

# Generous company comes to rescue of Highcrest breakfast club

The generosity of a High Wycombe company has safeguarded the future of a breakfast club which provides a vital early-morning service for dozens of pupils. The club at The Highcrest Academy has been running for a number of years but its future was uncertain after a previous sponsorship deal came to an end.

The school in High Wycombe appealed earlier this year to local companies via the Bucks Business First organisation – and was thrilled this month when RaySpec Ltd of Gordon Road stepped forward and offered to sponsor the club. Dr Peter Smith, Managing Director of the firm which manufactures scientific instruments, explained: "We have been based in the High Wycombe area since our formation in 1997 and our shareholders believe strongly in corporate social responsibility. We are keen to make some funds available to support the local community and the Highcrest breakfast club is a great initiative which directly benefits young people and their families."

Joe Clarke, Assistant Headteacher at Highcrest, said: "We were enormously grateful to RaySpec for coming forward to help us in this way. "This is an extra-curricular activity so it's not one that can come out of normal school funding. Highcrest arranges it all, but has to pay for two staff and supply all the food which costs a considerable amount of money. We can meet some of the cost, namely the staff, but unfortunately, the club may not have been able to continue unless we found another source of funding to support the provision of food. Thankfully, RaySpec have come to our rescue so that has been avoided." Mr Clarke added: "Breakfast is said to be the most important meal of the day and, yet, for whatever reason students don't always have time to grab something to eat before they leave for school. This therefore gives them a great start to their day."

Highcrest also thanked local councillor Julia Wassell who donated funds from her councillor's ward budget as an interim measure while a sponsor was being sought. Cllr Wassell said: "I am delighted that a generous sponsor has come

forward to support this important club.



## Widower urges others to support **Butterfly House South Bucks Hospice in their wills**

Pensioner Duncan Tucker. 75. from Widmer End is urging others to make provision for South Bucks Hospice in their wills after he pledged 2.5% of his estate to the charity. The pledge is in recognition of the support given to him and his late wife, Kay.

The retired biomedical scientist has been a regular visitor to the hospice in Kingswood Park, High Wycombe since Kay was a patient there in 2014. Kay, 73, who was also a biomedical scientist, and

had worked for over 30 years in the Microbiology Department of Wycombe Hospital, suffered from cancer. She visited the hospice weekly for two to three months, enjoying painting and baths there, until she was eventually too ill to attend.

But as her condition worsened, Duncan – who was caring for her at home – found he needed support and was given bereavement counselling by the hospice before her death. Now, almost five years later, he still attends the monthly Bereavement Group and also visits once a week to read to patients as a volunteer. He describes the hospice as a 'brilliant place', in particular because it offers total care for as long as the patient or loved one needs it.

"It does however cost about £800,000 annually to maintain the structure and provide the essential professional support. Throughout the nation today, there exists a culture of charitable giving, but sadly, the local facilities are so often overlooked - visible, yet forgotten - when high-profile national charities appear regularly on the television screens of our homes.

Duncan says "I would therefore ask others in all sincerity, to make South Bucks Hospice one of their priorities. In doing so, you will have the assurance that their work of palliative therapy and support is continued, and that there will always be a place of comfort for those whom you love - who are left to struggle through their lives without you".

"By making charitable bequests in your will you may also be able to reduce the rate of inheritance tax due; the benefit to your chosen charities, however, will be immense."

## Chilterns 3 Peaks Challenge - Sunday 8 September 2019






