

All change on the busses

Those of you who are regular bus users will have noticed there have been some changes to local services in the Wycombe area. It is probably safe to say that in most cases services have been reduced and that is particularly notable for late evening services making it difficult for anyone to get home after a night out at the theatre, cinema, pub, restaurant, party or other event held in the town.

Notably the following services have changed:

Route 31 - Has now been further reduced to a half-hourly service during the daytime. Launched as part of the "Rainbow Routes" the every 15 minute service to Penn is now half what is was.

Route 48 - Has now been re-numbered the 41. The original route number is now used for the service to Lane End.

Other services passing through Totteridge and Terriers are largely unchanged although the Route 1 recently introduced a variant "1A" that takes a different routing to Amersham-on-the-hill.

Updating our urban garden pictures

Highcrest is first secondary school in Bucks to win Unicef gold



The Highcrest Academy is celebrating after becoming the first secondary school in Bucks to win a prestigious gold award from the children's charity Unicef. Highcrest in High Wycombe became one of only a select number of secondary schools in the entire country to achieve gold level in the United Nations charity Unicef's Rights Respecting Schools Award (RRSA).

The award is granted to schools that show commitment to promoting and realising children's rights and encouraging adults, children and young people to respect the rights of others in school. Gold is the highest accolade given by Unicef UK which shows a deep and thorough commitment to children's rights.

Two inspectors visited Highcrest earlier this term and gave it a glowing report, labelling it 'an inclusive and supportive learning community where respect plays an integral part and rights are actively promoted and upheld'. In their summary, the inspectors said: "The academy has come a long way since 2001 when it was a 'Fresh Start' school where the numbers of students for whom it was the first choice was in single figures... Highcrest has changed radically since then. It is now the only all-ability academy in Buckinghamshire."

"The inspectors talked to staff across all areas of the school and to 20% of the students to check that we were on track. The school community has worked hard over a number of years to embed children's rights into everything we do and the award is recognition of this."

Principal Glen Burke added: "It's a real honour to have achieved this. Looking on the Unicef website, only a relatively small number of other secondary schools in the country are named as having won this, so we are thrilled to join this illustrious list."


According to Unicef, the RRSA recognises achievement in putting the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child at the heart of a school's planning, policies and practice. A Rights Respecting School is a community where children's rights are learned, taught, practised, respected, protected and promoted.




"Save a Life" scheme -

From Westminster to Wycombe - Steve Baker MP

Readers of this magazine who follow the news will know I recently took the difficult decision to resign from the Department for Exiting the EU following the Cabinet's policy agreement on this country's future relationship with the EU. I resigned as a matter of principle, as ministers who cannot accept collective responsibility for policy must leave the Government. The Chequers policy marked a departure from the policy being developed by the ministerial team at DExEU. I believe the Establishment in the UK is not persuaded of the merits of our leaving the EU, so it has sought to remain as close to the EU as feasible, knowing that to

be virtually impossible to reconcile with the implications of a Leave vote or the EU's legal order.

Back in March President Tusk, on behalf of the European Council, proposed a security partnership, participation in institutions related to research and innovation, culture and education, dealing with potential absurdities like any threat to flights and a free trade agreement covering all sectors with zero tariffs and including services. If the political and administrative will could be found to solve the issues at the Irish border, that settlement would make us a normal independent country. I know Brexit is, rightly, a matter of serious concern to the people of this country and I will continue to speak-up for the interests of Wycombe constituents from the backbenches.

You may have heard about the reorganisation of local government and the possibility of the county and district councils merging to form one new unitary authority. The Secretary of State recently announced he is 'minded to' decide in favour of one county-wide unitary although he gave more time for the councils to discuss how this might work. The deadline for receiving responses to this proposition has now passed, and the comments constituents shared with me were roughly split between those in favour of the proposal and those who opposed it. The Secretary of State has yet to issue his final ruling and I know many councillors and officials are reluctant to take any significant spending decisions until this is confirmed. This situation cannot be left unresolved for too long and I, along with other Bucks MPs, are urging him to give his final determination as soon as possible.

This year Parliament is celebrating the 100th anniversary of women being given the vote. A new exhibition about the campaign for votes for women, and the representation of women in the House of Commons and House of Lords opened in late June in the Palace of Westminster. It tells the story of women in Parliament using immersive technologies and features rare historic objects, pictures and archives from the Parliamentary collections. If anyone would like to see the exhibition it is open to the public, free of charge, until 6th October and full details can be found on www.parliament.uk/vote100. I am also happy to arrange general tours of Parliament at any time for constituents or local groups who would like them. Staff in my constituency office will be happy to make the arrangements on my behalf.

High Wycombe's aircraft industry

Many people know that during the Second World War, High Wycombe furniture factories were used for the production of parts for the Mosquito aircraft, which was largely made from wood. Local engineering factories were also used to manufacture various components as part of the war effort.

Did you know that during the early part of the 20th century High Wycombe was a world leader in the production of aircraft?

On October 12th the High Wycombe Society, as part of their 50th anniversary year, will be hosting a talk by local aviation historian Dave Scott at the Riverside in St. Mary Street at 7.30pm about pioneering aircraft manufacturer George Holt Thomas, a local man, who founded "Airco," which by 1918 had become the largest aircraft manufacturing company in the World. They built aeroplanes, aero-engines, propellers, airships and flying boats. In 1916 he founded one of the World's first airlines, Aircraft Transport and Travel (AT&T), who in 1919 operated the World's first international, daily, regular, scheduled air service.

Admission is free to all, and refreshments will be on sale at the end of the meeting, giving time to mingle and chat and find out more about the society. There is limited parking at the Riverside, but the Swan multi storey is opposite. Dave, along with associate, Ian Simmons has written a book which will be on sale at the meeting which tells of the life and achievements of this forgotten pioneer.


