



#### END OF AN ERA #2

After reporting my own retirement after 23 years with the club in the last issue of T&T News, it is with much regret and sadness that our club

chairman throughout my long tenure, Eric Chapman, passed away suddenly and unexpectedly while overseas enjoying another of his passions, plane spotting, on 02/08/19. Eric was not just a long standing friend but also co-founder of Totteridge FC along with myself in 1996 with his son Michael joining my own son Paul becoming some of the first players to join the club. He has been chairman since 1997 and Club Welfare Officer since the position was introduced by the FA, he was very much a part of the history, structure, culture and integrity of the club and worked tirelessly and selflessly to keep the club on a good financial standing, promote excellent values and ensure the club operated within the FA regulations regarding child welfare – he will be greatly missed at the club.

On a more personal level, he showed an immense concern and compassion over my own health scare over the past few years and was a driving force in insisting I put my health before the club, even delaying his own retirement to allow me to step-down first. I am eternally grateful to him for all his help and advice over the years and making my retirement that much easier.

His love for football extended beyond Totteridge FC where he was a season ticket holder at Wycombe Wanderers for many years and could be found on the terrace behind the goal, on many occasions we held an impromptu meeting prior to the match to discuss some club business and likewise, Wanderers inevitably found their way onto the club meeting agenda!

In the wake of my resignation, we welcomed in Simon Kearey as our new club secretary. Simon answered our call at the 11th hour and rescued the club days before our AGM when a final decision on the future of the club would have to be made. Simon comes in with a wealth experience of youth football having held similar positions elsewhere. With the sudden loss of Eric, I am grateful that Simon has agreed to take over Eric's CWO duties with immediate effect. This is a compulsory position and Simon's actions has ensured the continuity of the club into the new season.

One of Eric's final official club duties was to hand out the trophies at the club's annual awards ceremony which was held at the High Wycombe Cricket Club. It is always pleasing to be able to recognise and celebrate players individual achievements with an array of awards but for me this was quite an emotional event marking the end of my 24 years as club secretary, made even more so by the recent events. ### Highcrest boosted with bursary after trailblazing Careers Leader completes course

A member of staff at The Highcrest Academy has become the first person in the UK to complete a prestigious new training scheme delivered by the Career Development Institute. Rob Evans, 59, a former senior civil servant now Careers Leader at the High Wycombe school, was among the first cohort of 12 students to take the CDI course which started last December and was funded by The Careers and Enterprise Company.



He said: "I found the course very useful, and was honoured to be the first person to pass the Careers Leader training course with the CDI. "It deepened my understanding of all the academic research that underpins what we do as careers leaders and it helped me to build a network with other schools to find out what they do and to share ideas."

Mr Evans was given five days of formal classroom training, delivered by highly-experienced career development professional Claire Nix, and had to then complete 90 hours of self-directed study. The training is fully funded by the C&EC and the school is awarded a £1,000 bursary for those Careers Leaders who complete it successfully.

Highcrest Principal Glen Burke said: "Rob Evans' strong careers leadership has been of huge benefit to our students and I am confident that it will impact positively on their futures. He has helped pioneer a number of initiatives that will help them identify and discover jobs after they leave our academy. We were delighted with his success on this course, which will certainly make our careers work even more effective than ever."


Claire Johnson, of the Career Development Institute which is the professional body for the sector, said: "Careers Leaders such as Rob, working in conjunction with professionally-qualified Careers Advisers, make a huge difference to the lives of young people and their future careers. "The recent Careers Leaders in Schools Report published by the C&EC reveals that Careers Leaders are overwhelmingly positive about the approach to careers education currently underway and the outcomes for young people. 88% say their role is having a positive impact, 75% saying careers provision has improved over the last 18 months and 94% saying Gatsby Benchmarks have improve careers guidance.

"Rob's evaluation of the training programme and its impact on both him as a Careers Leader and his work in developing the careers programme at The Highcrest Academy was a pleasure to read and we wish him every success in the future."



#### From Westminster to Wycombe Steve Baker MP



Earlier this year the Government unveiled its NHS Long Term Plan, which aims to protect the health service now and in the future ensuring the NHS is always there for everyone. The Long Term Plan will transform patient care, with £4.5 billion being allocated to GP services and community care alone. I hold regular meetings with the chief executive of Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust which runs our hospitals, the Clinical Commissioning Group which decides on the services provided locally, and Oxford Health which is responsible for mental health. The meetings allow me to get a good understanding of the issues facing the NHS in our area, and I also have the opportunity to raise individual constituent's issues and concerns.

The Care Quality Commission inspects NHS and care services to ensure they meet national guidelines for both care and safety. The CQC published its latest report on our local hospital services on 18th June 2019. It found overall the service offered was Good, with the Caring element rated Outstanding. This is excellent news and shows just how much the local hospital services have improved over the last few years. We have much to be proud of. Wycombe Hospital is one of the top places in the country to be treated for heart and stroke conditions, and the hospital's new state-of-the-art catheter laboratory means 700 more patients can be seen in Wycombe for such things are angiograms and the fitting of pacemakers.


Another issue which I know constituents care deeply about is care for the environment. I was recently approached by a farmer living in the constituency about animal welfare issues and farm payments, which I was able to raise directly with the Secretary of State. He also told me of his work creating wild flower meadows, which have the benefit of both looking beautiful but also providing a good habitat for traditional pollinators such as bees, butterflies and insects. He kindly invited me to visit his meadow which I had the pleasure to do one sunny morning in June when the meadow was at its most splendid. If you are interested, you can see a video of my visit on my website.

I know it is important to protect our rural heritage for future generations. The meadow I visited had taken 10 years to be revitalised. Although things like wildflower meadows play a critical role in promoting biodiversity they usually cost the farmer to maintain. Good stewardship of the land is best achieved by protecting farmers' livelihoods.

## Ladies wow crowds at Royal Ascot with fashion items from **South Bucks Hospice sale**

To all the world, Vonnie Williams and Kati-Ann Bennett looked like ladies of high fashion when they rubbed shoulders with the great and the good at Royal Ascot. But unbeknown to onlookers at the glittering event earlier this summer, the women had picked up their stunning outfits at a charity sale in aid of South Bucks Hospice.

Barbara Pickersgill, who regularly runs the '50/50' sales to raise funds for the hospice in High Wycombe, explained: "They both looked absolutely amazing, and I think people would have been surprised to find the clothes they were wearing had come from a charity sale. "Both of them were delighted with their purchases and thought it was fantastic they had gone to Royal Ascot wearing them."



Vonnie, from Flackwell Heath, wore a black, yellow and white coat she had bought from Barbara's sale in May. Kati-Ann, from Beaconsfield, donned a black and white dress she had found at the same charity event. Both outfits cost less than £50. Barbara, from Bourne End, runs the 50/50 sales twice a year, normally at her home. She invites women to donate unwanted items from their wardrobes. Half of the profits from any sale go to the hospice, while the donor benefits from the other 50% but often, the women involved give all the proceeds to the charity.

Over the years, Barbara has raised thousands of pounds for patients with life-limiting conditions by running this event. £2,000 alone was raised at the event in May. In addition, a lot of unused items from the sale go to the hospice's shops at Bourne End and Hazlemere. "More and more people are donating clothes to me, and they love the fact that by doing so, they are helping the hospice," added Barbara. "A lot of women buy an outfit for one occasion and then never wear it again. There has been a lot in the media about upcycling clothes that would normally be thrown away, and it's lovely to show it works."




## Terriers Evening W.I.
