





Highcrest students praised for helping women's aid charity

Students at The Highcrest Academy have won the thanks and praise of Wycombe Women's Aid (WWA) after raising hundreds of pounds to help the charity support victims of domestic violence. The school in Hatters Lane, High Wycombe chose WWA



as its charity partner of the year in September, and has since held several successful events in aid of the cause.

Pupils have enjoyed a fundraising disco, cake sales, a non-uniform day, a sponge-a-teacher game, as well as a fun photo competition in which staff brought pictures of when they were babies and asked students to guess who was who.

The latest event was a supermarket bag pack at Waitrose & Partners in High Wycombe on January 31. This is a traditional fundraiser for the school's nominated charity - but this year's was the most successful ever with £334 being collected in just two hours. So far, a total of around £1,200 has been raised in just over one term. The work and dedication of the student bag-packing team delighted the charity, who described the event as a great success.

The charity supports women and children who are experiencing or trying to escape domestic violence and who are dealing with its effects and consequences.

Head Girl Tracy Ibom, 17, was one of 11 students who travelled to the store. She stood in the foyer holding a collection bucket, while fellow students of all ages manned the end of the tills and packed bags. Tracy described the donations as 'fantastic'. "People have given so generously," she said. "They have been light-hearted and positive towards us, and lots of shoppers have complimented our students for their manners."

Assistant Headteacher David Mizera accompanied the Highcrest group to the supermarket. He said the experience had been important in showing the value of skills such as team-work, sensitivity and communication.

He also praised Waitrose & Partners for allowing the visit and said: "I am delighted with the way it's gone. The students' decorum and the way they spoke to people was very impressive. Shoppers have been very positive."





Walking Wycombe with Willie

Join Willie Reid for some short walks around Wycombe Town this spring....

Saturday 25 April

Walking Wycombe with Willie starting at the museum in Priory Avenue at 10.15. Distance 1 mile in 2 hours. No need to book - just turn up! On this free circular historical walk discover the world renowned institution that started life in the town and why Wycombe Wanderers score in the Guinness Book of Records. And although Britain voted for Brexit, gaze upon what will still be Wycombe's claim to European fame even after we leave the EU.'

Sunday 26 April

This is a shorter, completely flat version of the above walk which lasts for one hour and is suitable for buggies/wheelchairs/dogs. This leisurely stroll starts at 2pm from Pann Mill on The Rye (HP11 1BJ) and finishes in Frogmoor.

Friday 8 May

'Road, Rail, River and Riots' starts at 10.00 from Wycombe Lido car park, Bassetsbury Lane, High Wycombe HP11 1QX - distance 2.5 miles in 2.5 hours. This free walk is circular following the River Wye downstream to Kingsmead. Find out who was the first English king to 'tweet', view the best preserved mill wheel on the Wye, walk part of the Brunel engineered railway line to Wycombe, discover the milestone which indicates the halfway point between London and Oxford and hear the story of the 1830 machine breakers riots.

Saturday 23 May

Rusty, Knights, Mosquitos and more.....

This NEW free circular historical walk starts at the museum in Priory Avenue at 10.15 and includes one short steep climb. Distance 3 miles in 2 hours. No need to book - just turn up! Come and hear about the industry that made Wycombe famous throughout the world, learn about Wycombe's serial criminal and also of the club where practical jokes and amorous pursuits were encouraged.




likely many local residents missed the opportunity to attend and comment.

The development was originally for around 360 dwellings but this was increased to up to 500 by the planning inspector. However, the developers asked for an increase to at least 700. Save a Life Campaign – New Defibrillator at Eden Bus Station

A new defibrillator has been fitted at High Wycombe Bus Station and is available to the public from 0500 until 2230. The unit has been supplied and fitted by the Eden Shopping Centre management with the storage box and other support being supplied by the local team of South Central Ambulance Charity, Thames Valley Police and Hazlemere Fete. The unit is fitted internally adjacent to the rear exit doors.

If you think someone is suffering from a cardiac arrest call 999 immediately. The 999 operator will advise you how to

assess the patient and may ask you to commence Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) immediately. If you are not familiar just search "How to do CPR" on your PC or mobile device.

If a cardiac arrest is suspected and if another person is available ask them to get the nearest defibrillator. The first person may be asked to continue CPR. If in the vicinity of High Wycombe Bus Station obtain this one as soon as possible. The defibrillator yellow storage box is locked but the 999 operator will provide the 5 digit code to open the box.
