




Caring Highcrest students see messages of support to elderly shown on ITV news

Kind-hearted students at The Highcrest Academy sent poems, pictures and letters to elderly residents of a care home to support them during the Coronavirus crisis. The pupils were then stunned to see their messages featured on the ITV news as part of a report on the response to the home's appeal for people to get in touch.

The Swarthmore Care Home in Gerrards Cross was inundated with letters of support after asking the public on Facebook to send messages to residents who are no longer able to receive visitors due to social distancing measures. The ITV report, televised in March, told how the home had received letters and cards from around the world. Around a dozen of these came from The Highcrest Academy in High Wycombe where Sue Charlesworth, Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator, passed the appeal on to students in years 7 and 8.

"In total about 12 messages were sent from Highcrest students and amazingly many of these featured on the news segment with ITV. Students were thrilled to see the impact of their work and the joy on the faces of the residents." During the ITV piece, residents – who are aged from 76 to 101 - told how pleased they were to receive the messages.

Mrs Charlesworth from Highcrest added: "Students at The Highcrest Academy are all naturally caring. They have a natural curiosity about the world around them and so this was a task they could easily relate to. They have grandparents etc who are also having to distance themselves. Their messages were mostly about keep smiling and remaining positive, an outlook that we all need to adopt and comes naturally to them. These students are a pleasure to teach."

Claire Allsopp, Manager of the care home, said staff and residents were overwhelmed with joy and gratitude when the messages from Highcrest arrived.

The home was so touched by Highcrest's gesture that it says it will invite the children to visit the residents after the Coronavirus crisis is over.

Life for all of us has changed dramatically during the coronavirus crisis. Parliament has returned and MPs are ensuring the Government is scrutinised and your concerns represented. There is a limit on the number of MPs who can be in the Chamber at the moment, and I am only travelling occasionally into Westminster. We are currently using a hybrid model, and I am spending a great deal of time contributing to debates, asking questions and participating in the work of the Treasury Select Committee via a video link from my home office.

Over the past few weeks, I have been contacted by many constituents who have questions and concerns about the Government's plans for combatting Covid-19. My team and I have been in continuous contact with local individuals and businesses to solve problems, provide support and make suggestions to Ministers. Bucks Business First is coordinating local support for business; it has details of all the Government schemes to help companies, the self-employed and non-statutory organisations and I want to pay tribute to their work.

Throughout the coronavirus period, I and my fellow Bucks MPs have been in regular contact with the NHS, Buckinghamshire Council, and Thames Valley Police about our public services' response to the crisis. All local volunteers, our public servants, together with key workers in the private sector, deserve our thanks, praise and support for their outstanding work. So, whatever part you have played over the past few weeks to keep our community together, I sincerely thank you.

Thanks to the tremendous work of staff, the NHS has had sufficient capacity to meet the demands made of it. It is important people with concerns about other health issues should not be reluctant to ask for medical help at this time: staff are available to deal with all medical problems, not just those with symptoms of Covid-19.

All the machinery of Government has bent to the task of building a bridge for business through this crisis in the hope we will recover swiftly. Restrictions to be eased as it is safe to do so and we will all be able to resume more normal lives once again.

South Bucks Hospice predicts flood of counselling requests after Coronavirus lockdown

A hospice that was forced to temporarily close its building during the Coronavirus crisis is expecting a deluge of requests for help from the public in the coming months. Juliette Coffey, Head of Individual and Family Support at South Bucks Hospice in High Wycombe, says there is likely to be huge demand on the charity's counselling services after social isolation rules are relaxed.

The lockdown has meant funds for the day hospice have dried up because it has had to temporarily close its shops and several planned fundraising events have had to be cancelled. The charity's headquarters, Butterfly House in Kingswood Park, High Wycombe, also closed during lockdown to protect vulnerable patients, and several staff had to be furloughed.



Juliette, who heads a ten-strong counselling team which includes many qualified volunteer counsellors, said: "It will take us a while to recover financially from having to temporarily close our shops and the cancellation of community fundraising events. The public getting behind us and remembering us at this difficult time and beyond the lockdown period is so much appreciated and vital to our ability to continue what we do." She explained: "People's emotions often become frozen in the midst of a traumatic situation and it's only when you come out of the worst of the crisis that you process what you have gone through and want to talk."

Juliette and her team have been working from their homes and giving free counselling to almost 40 people. Many of their clients are suffering anxiety and distress as a result of the Covid-19 outbreak, and some have lost loved ones. Others are cancer patients who are worried about going to hospital for treatment and then catching the potentially-fatal virus.

Meanwhile, South Bucks Hospice staff nurse Karen Turner has also been offering expert telephone support to around 40 patients.



We've seen a surge in neighbourliness as people look out for the vulnerable and talk to those next door more than ever before, a silver lining to the cloud COVID-19 has cast over our daily lives.

Since early March, Neighbourhood Watch has been encouraging people to 'Be Kind, Connect, Support and Share' during these challenging times as part of the Community Action Response led by Eden Project Communities in response to the pandemic. APPEAL UPDATE FOR 2020

This appeal was launched in October 2018 to raise £350,000 to fully equip a dedicated biopsy suite with 3D mammography technology. The suite will improve the patient experience and reduce waiting times. Targeted biopsies will be carried out quicker with pinpoint accuracy, significantly reducing the time patients need to wait from diagnosis to treatment. In addition, this cutting edge equipment will help in diagnosing very small cancers at an early stage. We currently have raised over £250,000 and hope that the equipment will be in place by late summer.

Bucks MRI Appeal

The largest appeal that Scannappeal has been involved in its 32 year history is for £1.5 million. The appeal is raising money for two world class Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) scanners with state of the art techniques for enhanced image quality.


The scanners have a much wider opening and are a lot quieter which greatly improves the patient experience. Over 22,000 people have an MRI scan in Bucks every year. Over £1 million has already been raised and the first scanner has been delivered to Wycombe hospital. We are now continuing to fundraise for the second scanner at Stoke Mandeville hospital.

During this period of lock down Terriers WI's meetings have, along with all other social gatherings been suspended for an indefinite period so some of us have been recording our thoughts and experiences of this very strange time.

Many of us are able to remember the days when the arrival of the Corona man was something to be greeted with delight when he arrived outside the house on a hot summer day with his lorry full of fizzy pop. Back in the 1950s no-one worried too much about the consumption of tooth-rotting, obesity-promoting sugary drinks so Corona was something to be welcomed. How times have changed!

Now, as stalwart members of the Women's Institute we tackle, with fortitude and humour, the worries and privations that confront us at this strange and difficult time. We would like to share a few of those experiences below

"In particular one of the most common experiences has been that of the kindness of others. In my own road the neighbours have been wonderful, checking on those we know to be frail or alone, collecting shopping and chatting on the doorsteps, at the appropriate social distance, of course. One neighbour shared a bag of flour with us so we were able to make hot cross buns for many folk. We share vegetable plants and, somehow inadvertently, a paper-back book exchange seems to have started up on my drive after I tried to clear out my unwanted novels. The lovely sunshine has helped, of course to make lock down more bearable and our proximity to both park and common makes for easily accessible daily walks."

"The good weather has prompted all the gardening that never seems to get done under normal circumstances. A daily walk and the beautiful countryside. The 100 miles target set for the centenary of the WI will be easily achievable. A What's App group set up for our residents association has much interaction with previously unknown neighbours and countless offers of help from people still going to the shops. When the weather is not as good as it has been lately the recycling project of greetings cards will continue. Carol and I have kept in touch with our members to chat and see how they are and to ascertain that they are coping, and to pass on news of other members."

"What I would like to do is say how much I appreciate the acts of kindness shown to me by friends and strangers alike. For instance one friend adds my shopping list to her online order and then one of her adult children leaves my groceries at my door; this involves a car journey. As to how I spend my time, well much of it is thinking about jobs I could undertake but reading, crosswords, jigsaw puzzles and various handicrafts take precedence and the jobs can wait."

"There is, they say, a first time for everything and it came upon us one day in March. From a country thousands of miles away a highly infectious virus that did not like being shut indoors set upon a world-wide tour. Time and routine are no more. By staying in we will win. It's a struggle and a muddle but don't despair we have the caring NHS and nature will repair."
