



Highcrest students win thanks for helping homeless in Wycombe

Caring students at The Highcrest Academy have raised more than £2,500 for homeless people over the past few months – despite being in lockdown for much of the year.



Pupils at the school in High Wycombe selected Wycombe Homeless Connection as their charity for 2020-2021 at the start of the academic year in September.

The academy chooses a different charity every year and normally raises thousands of pounds. However, lockdown meant that some activities – such as a supermarket bag pack – were unable to go ahead. Despite this, resourceful staff and students still managed to bring the pounds rolling in by organising events such as: non-uniform days, a penalty shoot-out, five-a-side football, a doughnut sale, a 'guess-the-sweets-in-a-jar' competition, a Christmas jumper day and an Easter egg raffle. By the end of April £2,524.60 had been raised.

Head Girl Aiman Mahmood, 17, said: "Homelessness is an issue in our society that has increasingly been affected by the current pandemic. It has fuelled a much stronger and empathetic ambition for us to support those who have no choice but to live and sleep on the streets. Our students are more strong-willed and determined to make a real difference to those suffering hardship. "This is why we are proud to have raised a substantial amount to play our part in helping and providing service to those in need. I have been extremely privileged to have seen the commitment and devotion of my fellow peers who have fundraised remarkably, despite the difficulties faced in lockdown. This shows that when a community comes together, a little from everyone can go a long way."

James Boultbee, Chief Executive Officer of Wycombe Homeless Connection (WHC), said in a message to the school: "This is outstanding work from the staff and students at Highcrest. It has been such a difficult past few months and I can only imagine what it must be like experiencing all this during your school years which just makes us so grateful for all the hard work and money raised. We've been working to make sure that no one has to sleep rough on our streets during this pandemic and we've also been working to stop people from losing their homes as a result too. The support we've had from Highcrest directly helps us to do that, so thank you all!".

* The Highcrest Academy has thanked the local community for its tremendous response to an appeal featured in the last issue of T&T News for help with its new gardening club, Highcrest Horticulture. Donations of cash, compost and plants have poured in since the appeal was launched earlier this year. More on this in the next edition

More patients welcomed back at South Bucks Hospice as lockdown restrictions are eased

Staff at South Bucks Hospice were thrilled at being able to welcome more patients back for face-to-face sessions after lockdown restrictions were eased. The hospice has been providing a mix of telephone and online video support throughout the pandemic - with face-to-face appointments being offered for physiotherapy, nursing care and lymphoedema treatment where it was thought vital for the patients' health and well-being. Face-to-face group sessions were paused during lockdown, with some moving online.

However, more face-to-face contact became available again in the hospice at Butterfly House, Kingswood Park, High Wycombe when restrictions eased from the week beginning May 17. "We are doing face-to-face sessions with those who are comfortable with this but are still continuing to support others by video and telephone if that is their preference," said Jackie Ward, Acting Chief Executive Officer. "Before May 17, restrictions meant we could only see a smaller number of patients once they had been risk-assessed, but now are starting to return to normal. People who need counselling and complementary therapy can now get face-to-face appointments and we are slowly reopening group sessions."

Staff at the hospice are now being tested for covid three times a week and other measures, such as social distancing and hand sanitation stations, are in place. Jackie Ward added: "We are doing this as safely as possible to ensure the well-being of our staff, patients and volunteers. However, this return has been a real boost for us and we believe that offering more face-to-face sessions will be of enormous benefit to our patients, many of who are suffering with life-limiting conditions. We are also welcoming customers back to our shops. "We do, realise the situation is ever changing but we feel we are flexible and fully prepared for any eventuality that comes our way. Hopefully, there won't be a further lockdown – but if there is, we are ready for it and know from last year's experiences that we can support our patients effectively if that happens."

The hospice's shops at High Heavens, Bourne End, Hazlemere and Aston Clinton fully re-opened in April.


