Hospice seeks volunteers for new bereavement listening service



Volunteers are being asked to step forward to take part in a training course to learn how to help local bereaved people come to terms with their loss

The free ten-week programme is being run one morning a week on Mondays from September to December by South Bucks Hospice at Butterfly House in High Wycombe.

It will pave the way for a new Volunteer Bereavement Listening Service at the hospice – and community-minded people who successfully complete the course will be asked to join the team as volunteers when it is launched in January 2022.

Juliette Coffey, Head of Individual and Family Support at South Bucks Hospice, said: "We are seeking compassionate and empathetic people to help make this work for those in the local community who so urgently need our help. This is a wonderful opportunity to join a day hospice with big aspirations to increase the reach of our service provision and to help us to make a real difference to the lives of those we care for.

"This is a volunteer role requiring a time commitment of between 3-7 hours per week and the successful candidates will ideally have previous experience in working or volunteering in a listening capacity."

Juliette added: "This is a particularly poignant time to launch this badlyneeded service for people in Bucks. As well as supporting families and carers who have been bereaved through the loss of those who have needed our palliative care services, we know so many people have been bereaved by the pandemic and have not yet had a full chance to process and understand their feelings."

The facility is run and managed by the South Central Ambulance Service which covers Bucks, Berks, Oxon and Hampshire.

Over 80 million vaccine doses have now been administered in the UK, and I am pleased most of the coronavirus restrictions ended in July. The Prime Minister has been clear people's personal judgement will now be key in learning to live with the virus, although I would expect people to be mindful of those who are nervous about the restrictions being eased.

I know the past year has been difficult for so many people. Visits to care homes should now be easier, and indoor and outdoor gatherings, including weddings and funerals, will be able to go ahead without limits being placed on them. I recently attended a wedding, the first wedding I had been to in a long time, and it was wonderful to be sharing life's celebrations with others again.

One matter I have taken-up with local NHS leaders is the pressure put on the Urgent Treatment Centre at Wycombe Hospital when patients struggle to see their GP. I know our local GPs are working hard to see a higher number of patients fast. It's vital the public receive the service they need.

Proof of vaccination or a negative test is still required for international travel. I know many people, including me, chose to holiday in the UK this year. However, I'm also conscious people want to travel abroad for some sun and a well-deserved break. There are, of course, many individuals for whom travelling abroad isn't a holiday, but the only way to see their family. That is why people who have been fully vaccinated with an NHS administered vaccine have been able to travel from amber list countries to England without having to quarantine.

Once furlough ends in September, we may begin to see the full impact the pandemic has had on jobs and the economy. Thanks to the Government's Covid-19 economic support, I am hoping that we will bounce back quickly and continue with the strong economic performance that we were experiencing prior to Covid.

I am pleased to see how much the country enjoyed the Euro 2020 football and the Olympics earlier this summer. A number of Olympians come from our area, or trained locally, and I send my congratulations to all the coaches, competitors and medal winners. With the country's success in the swimming and diving competitions I hope this may inspire young people to take-up competitive water sports. We are fortunate in Wycombe to have a number of fantastic clubs and I hope the home-grown successes at the Olympics will encourage people to try any of the sports of swimming, para swimming, diving, water polo, open water swimming or artistic swimming. Obviously there are other sports where we have excelled too and I would encourage everyone, whatever their age, to think about taking-up a sport.

Students plant 150 new trees at The Highcrest Academy



Students at The Highcrest Academy in High Wycombe planted 150 new trees at the school as they prepared a new wildlife area to serve generations of pupils to come.

The trees were donated by a company called Fusion JV, who are committed to increasing the natural woodland for schools in the Chilterns, and included holly, dog rose, willow and hazel. They were planted near the car park on the school field by 'Forest School' students in Year 10 and 11.

Principal Glen Burke gathered together with staff and students recently to place a plaque on one of the trees and mark the creation of the new woodland area.

Teaching assistant Alice Watson, who is Forest School Practitioner, said: "The plaque read 'Planted by Class of 2020/2021'. This will be a poignant reminder of who planted them when the trees grow. The Year 11s planted many of the trees before they left and this means there will be something of them left in the school to be enjoyed by future generations and students. The planting was finished off by the Year 10s."

She added: "Both year groups were fabulous. I am proud of them and they should all be proud of their efforts and how it will impact the future student bodies."

Highcrest Horticulture began in March at the school under the guidance of Inclusion Support teacher Samantha Mills, who is the Project Leader. She said: "Six to eight students work on the project at a time in six-week programmes, which continue throughout the school year. We have been planting potatoes, runner beans, strawberries and have started designing the flower garden. The students have really enjoyed it and even those who aren't involved in the project are coming up to us and asking about it.

"We are very grateful for the response to our appeal for help from the public. It is validation of the work we are doing that people can see the worth of a programme like this. Thank you to everyone who has contributed." The programme has been designed to aid and inspire positive behaviour, social interaction and overall mental health and wellbeing in students. The school has designated a piece of land near the engineering block and there is room to grow into a nearby field.
