
The adjoining Terriers Conservation area is worth exploring too with plenty of areas to sit,

The hospice, based at Butterfly House in Kingswood Park, High Wycombe, is marking Volunteers' Week at the start of June by making a renewed appeal for community-minded residents to join its team.

In particular, the charity needs afternoon receptionists as well as bistro volunteers for Butterfly House. It also needs retail staff for its shops in Amersham and Chalfont St Peter.

Jackie Ward, Chief Executive Officer, explained: "We couldn't do what we currently do without our volunteers - they are a fantastic support for our organisation and we really want to grow our team to help patients and their families.

"We have great staff but they do need extra help because there is simply so much for us to do and to cover. 



I wonder do you know about the High Wycombe Town Twining Association and that it has existed for nearly 40 years?

It was started in 1985 when visitors from Kelkheim came to High Wycombe to enquire as to whether people in High Wycombe would be interested in and would like to "twin" with them and share cultural visits, school visits and general meeting of local residents of both towns to further understanding of each other's towns and country?

From June we will be known as **TERRIERS W.I**.

In March we held our annual AGM, as part of the NFWI we must submit annual reports and audited accounts to the National Federation WI. Our meeting started with the yearly reports from our President, Secretary and Treasurer. We have welcomed new members this year, with a membership of 30, and a good financial position, we look forward to the coming year.

The committee are looking into finding a new venue to hold our meetings, somewhere more central and with an earlier start time that would be more suitable for members without transport, (see above). After our new president was voted in, we finished with a quiz on photographs of famous people, followed by tea.

In April our speaker was Peter Healy from the Amersham Museum, he gave us an interesting talk and slideshow on photographs taken by George Ward.

George Ward lived in Old Amersham and took photos recording everyday life and special advents in Old Amersham from 1880 to 1930. When the railway came to the area in 1882 it was built on the hill and the new town of Amersham on the Hill started to develop a round it leaving the old town to keep its small and historical buildings which we can still see today. He also told us how the building of the gasworks in the town had divided people, as they were glad of the new gas lighting in their homes, but the gasworks were regarded as an eye saw.

At our May meeting we discussed and voted on this year's Resolution. There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists, and people are suffering health issues as a result. If passed at the AGM The NFWI would call upon the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentist and review the current inadequate NHS contracts to ensure everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live.

This was discussed at length and we voted to send the resolution forward with our delegate to vote at the NFWI AGM at the Royal Albert Hall in June. We ended the meeting with a show and tell by our members

"The Chiltern branch of the Motor Neurone Disease Association supports people living with Motor Neurone Disease (MND) and their carers in the Chiltern area. MND affects the nerves known as motor neurones that are found in the brain and spinal cord, and which help tell your muscles what to do. With MND, messages from the motor neurones gradually stop reaching the muscles. This leads the muscles to weaken, stiffen and waste, which can affect walking, talking, eating, drinking and breathing. MND is life shortening and there is no cure.

The branch supports people with the disease in a number of ways. Our volunteer Association Visitors offer 1-2-1 emotional support to people living with and affected by the disease and provide practical information to help ensure they get the support they need. We have monthly support meetings where people living with and affected by the disease can meet each other and our volunteers for an informal chat over tea and cake. These take place on the third Monday of the month in Cedar Barn in Hazlemere and the second Thursday of the month in Aylesbury Rugby Football Club (except for August). The branch, and the wider charity, also offer financial support grants to help with a number of different things including improving quality of life, providing equipment and helping with the cost of living with the disease.

To support our branch activities we run a number of fundraising events in the year and have others who kindly fundraise for us. We have a fundraising target in 2024 of £30,000. Our next event is an open gardens event at Bledlow Manor near Princes Risborough on Friday 14 June. The beautiful and extensive grounds will be open from 2pm to 5pm and we'll be serving tea/coffee and homemade cakes in the lovely tea rooms. Tickets are £7.50 in advance via Eventbrite, (search Bledlow Manor) or visit:

https://BledlowManorGardens.eventbrite.co.uk or tickets are available at £9 on the day. There is no charge for children under 5 or people with MND and their carers. For more information about our branch visit:

As 3.5 million people look to buy a used car Citizens Advice Bucks shares top advice tips to help motorists steer clear of problems

Problems with used cars are consistently the top complaint made to Citizens Advice Bucks.

New data reveals last year the charity's national Consumer Service received a complaint about a used car every three minutes. The amount of people calling the helpline last year from Bucks rose by 16% on the previous year. The majority of these (66%) complaints were about defective goods, while 13% concerned safety issues.

Craig Glynn, Interim Chief Officer of Citizens Advice Bucks, said:

"Unexpected car problems can cost us more than just money, they can leave people missing work or unable to drop their kids off at school. But all too often we hear from motorists who've had used cars mis-sold to them and have had to shell out hard-earned cash to fix surprise issues."

"Many of us across Buckinghamshire are feeling the pinch right now, so it's vital to make sure you're steering clear of surprise problems and are getting exactly what you paid for when buying a used car. Before making a big purchase like a used car, don't forget to brake, and make all the right checks before you buy."

Citizens Advice Bucks top tips:

- Check the trader
- Check the car's history

Paying for a used car

Ask questions if you're unsure about anything in the small print. Remember you can stop the deal if you feel like you're being pressured into paying too much or buying additional features. Make sure you get the original (not a photocopy) of the log book (the V5C registration certificate) and the valid MOT test document. Never buy a car without the log book.

If you make payment by a debit card you may have protection from your providers chargeback scheme. With a credit card as long as you paid more than £100 up to £30,000 even with a part payment you are covered under section 75 protection.
