Multi-million pound expansion begins at The Highcrest Academy

Pupils in High Wycombe are set to benefit from major refurbishment works at The Highcrest Academy as part of the school's expansion.

The £3.3m scheme will result in a new Sixth Form Centre, Dining Area, Science laboratory and Sports Hall extension - freeing space for additional classrooms to accommodate an extra 28 pupils per year group.

The work, being carried out by the County Council, using Government Basic Need Funding, began in November and is due to be completed in time for the beginning of the next academic year in September 2018.

Delighted Principal Glen Burke said: "We know that Highcrest is already a vibrant, thriving and successful school, but these improvements will further improve the quality of provision we are able to offer."

Under the plans, the following work is being carried out at the academy in Hatters Lane, High Wycombe:

- The old Sixth Form building will treble in size over two floors and will be remodelled to provide a modern Sixth Form Learning Resource Centre.
- The existing canteen and kitchen will be extended and will treble in size. The refurbishment will transform the area, creating a bright and modern dining room for both students and staff.
- A second floor above the front of the sports hall will be added to provide a new dance studio and fitness room, a state of the art gym and an additional PE theory classroom. The studio and gym will also be available for community use.
- An existing IT room and storeroom will be transformed into a new large science laboratory.

Mike Appleyard, Cabinet Member for Education and Skills at Buckinghamshire County Council, said: "In the High Wycombe area there's a need to expand school places by four to five forms of entry over the next three or four years - that's the equivalent of a new school. I'm delighted the refurbishment work to accommodate an additional form of entry at Highcrest will help to meet some of the increased demand."

From Westminster to Wycombe - Steve Baker MP

Until the end of the year, my work as a Minister in the Department for Exiting the European Union will revolve around leading the European Union (Withdrawal) Bill in the Commons. The purpose of the Bill is to bring all current EU law into British law so that there will be a smooth transition as the country leaves the EU and to make the UK an independent country. It is expected to be one of the most significant legislative processes ever undertaken. This means I will spend a lot of time in the House of Commons setting out the Government's position and answering questions from fellow

parliamentarians. There are three principal purposes to the Bill: repealing the European Communities Act; converting all EU law into UK law; and creating the necessary powers to correct deficiencies in EU law arising from our withdrawal.

Although my Ministerial responsibilities are large, I maintain my strong commitment to the people of the town. I continue to attend many civic, charity and community functions and I hold advice bureaux for constituents regularly. This allows me to hear people's experiences at first hand and in turn I make representations to Ministers and other authorities. One issue which a number of people have raised with me is the matter of housing availability, especially for younger people who are facing the real prospect of having to move away from the Wycombe area to find affordable accommodation. I have been clear I support the building of new housing in the area, particularly on brownfield sites in High Wycombe. I have heard that some letting agents in the area will not show rented housing to people earning less than £35,000. I think this illustrates the local housing situation has reached crisis point, and I have asked the local District Council to work with me to change this. If you have ideas for imaginative schemes to bring down rents and build more homes please let me know and I will be happy to take these to the relevant people.

A few weeks ago I accompanied Professor Jonathan Benger, the National Clinical Director for Urgent Care for NHS England, to Wycombe Hospital. I know that, just like me, almost everyone living in the area would like to see A&E at Wycombe Hospital. I asked Professor Benger to visit the hospital, view its facilities and give me his impartial view based on clinical evidence on whether it would be possible to have A&E returned. His view was that he thought Wycombe would be a good place for an Urgent Treatment Centre. An Urgent Treatment Centre would allow us to have the vast majority of the urgent treatment we need in Wycombe without having to travel to different hospitals. My meeting with Professor Benger confirmed my understanding that modern medicine means Wycombe will not see the return of an old-style A&E but that changes to services have been clinically led and are intended to produce the best possible outcomes for patients.

News in Brief

Rennie Grove

Once again this year Rennie Grove ran their Christmas Challenge from 28th November until 5th December. This year they were hoping to raise £8,000 from generous donations from supporters which will be doubled to raise £16,000. The money raised will be used to fund one of the Hospice at Home nursing teams over the festive season avoiding unnecessary hospital admissions and keeping families together at Christmas.

Wycombe District Council

On 8th October the council approved the final draft for the new local plan. This is an important document which sets out the policies which will help map out the future of the district. It also will be used as a guide for local development and planning decisions for the next 15 years. The final draft went out for a six week consultation the result of which is expected soon.

The plan shows where 10,925 new homes may be built and the required infrastructure up to 2033 and makes plans for new employment sites. Over half the housing provision will be in and around High Wycombe with a quarter allocated to Princes Risborough.

Community Impact Bucks

Trustees Week took place from the 13th - 17th November bringing a spotlight on the work that Trustee do. They are the people who are in charge of a charity overseeing the day-to-day running, its direction and compliance. They help make us the sixth most giving country in the world and play a vital role volunteering their time. With good leadership from the trustees a charity can help more people, deal with issues and take advantage of new opportunities.

Community Impact Bucks is working with the Henley Business School to offer free coaching support for charity leaders. In a recent survey 45% of trustees said they were too stretched and 19% said recruiting new trustees is one of their biggest challenges.

Local Crime Update

Recently there have been a number of break-in's in the Terriers area. These have been both into properties and outbuildings. As the dark nights are now with us its more important than ever to be vigilant and ensure your property is secure. Ensure all doors and widows are secure and outside doors have at least a double lock.

Head midwife advises pregnant women to go to sleep on their side

The head of midwifery at Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust, Heidi Beddall, is advising pregnant women to go to sleep on their side, in light of the results of a recent study the Trust was involved in.

Findings from the study, 'Association between maternal sleep practices and late stillbirth', were published on 20th November and show that mothers who went to sleep on their back had at least twice the risk of stillbirth compared with mothers who went to sleep on their side.

The Trust's maternity unit was one of the 41 units across the UK participating in the study, which interviewed 291 women who had a stillbirth and 733 women who had a live-born baby. It is the largest of four similar studies that have all shown the same link between the position in which a mother goes to sleep and stillbirth after 28 weeks of pregnancy.
